Genesis 8: God Remembers

The Flood began in the 600th year of Noah's life, in the <u>2nd</u> month on the <u>17th</u> day. (Gen 7:11)

Noah left the ark in the 601st year of his life, in the 2nd month on the 27th day. (Gen 8:14)

Chapter 8 starts at what point after the Flood begins? In what sense does God "remember" Noah? (8:1)

God made a <u>wind</u> (*ruwach*) blow over the earth. This is the same Hebrew word used in Genesis 1:2 and translated **Spirit**.

Recall that Noah's name (Noach) means <u>rest</u>. (Gen 5:29)

As the floodwater subsides, the ark comes to <u>rest</u> (nuwach) on the mountains of Ararat. (Gen 8:4)

The Hebrew word for ark (*tebah*) means **box**. It is used of Noah's ark as well as the smaller version used by **Moses**. (Ex 2:3)

The Hebrew word used for the ark of the covenant (*arown*) is also used to refer to Joseph's coffin. (Gen 50:26)

If the ark was just a big box, there was no means for <u>steering</u> or <u>propulsion</u>. After five months adrift, it just happened to run aground on perhaps the highest point on earth. While not stated explicitly, this historical detail points to **God's miraculous intervention**.

After a year of silence, God speaks. (Gen 8:16)

God is pleased with Noah's burnt offerings and makes what promise? (Gen 8:21-22)

What has changed about man's basic disposition after the Flood? (Gen 8:21)

Flood Chronology

- windows of heaven and fountains of the deep burst open (2nd month, 17th day) (7:11)
- rained 40 days and nights (7:12)
- flood "continued" 40 days (7:17)
- waters "prevailed" 150 days (7:24)
- waters subsided (8:2)
- rain restrained and fountains closed (8:2)
- waters receded (8:3)
- after 150 days waters had abated and ark ran aground (17th day, 7th month) (8:3-4)
- waters continued to abate (8:5)
- mountaintops became visible (1st day, 10th month) (8:5)
- Noah waited 40 days, sent out a raven (10th day, 11th month) (8:7)
- Noah waited 7 days, sent out a dove (she returned to the ark) (17th day, 11th month) (8:8)
- Noah waited 7 days, sent the dove again (brought back olive branch) (24th day, 11th month) (8:10)
- Noah waited 7 days, sent the dove again (did not return) (1st day, 12th month) (8:12)
- Cover of the ark removed after the ground was dry (1st day, 1st month) (8:13)
- God instructed Noah to come out (27th day, 2nd month) (8:14)

How do localized floods provide evidence in support of the Noahic flood?

Genesis 8 covers a period of about 331 days.
