## Interpretive Rules:

- 1. Genesis is <u>literal</u> <u>history</u>. (Luke 3:23-38)
- 2. **Scripture** interprets Scripture. (Matt. 4:5-7)
- 3. **Salvation** has always been by **grace** alone through **faith** alone. (Rom. 4:1-8)
- 4. **Christ** is in all the Scripture, including Genesis. (Luke 24:13-27)
- 5. Scripture is **transformational truth**. (Rom. 12:2)

There are 76 generations in Luke's genealogy. How many of these are found in the book of Genesis? (Luke 3:23-38)

Which specific "covenants" are found in Genesis?

- 1. Adamic (covenant of works—2:16-17)
- 2. **Noahic** (post-flood covenant—9:11)
- 3. Abrahamic (covenant of land & people—15:18-21)

Genesis is roughly **chronological**. *Very* roughly.

History is characterized by **people**, **places**, and **events**.

Approximate character divisions in Genesis:

- 1-5 Adam to Noah
- 6-11 Noah to Abraham
- 12-25 Abraham
- 25-27 Isaac
- 27-35 Jacob
- 36 Esau
- 37-50 Joseph
