WCF Ch 11, Of Justification, 5. God doth continue to forgive the sins of those that are justified; and, although they can never fall from the state of justification, yet they may, by their sins, fall under God's fatherly displeasure, and not have the light of His countenance restored unto them, until they humble themselves, confess their sins, beg pardon, and renew their faith and repentance (Psalm 32:5). WCF Ch 15, Of Repentance unto life, 6. As every man is bound to make private confession of his sins to God, praying for the pardon thereof; (Ps. 32:5–6) upon which, and the forsaking of them, he shall find mercy; so, he that scandalizeth his brother, or the Church of Christ, ought to be willing, by a private or publick confession, and sorrow for his sin, to declare his repentance to those that are offended, who are thereupon to be reconciled to him, and in love to receive him. WLC Q. 178. What is prayer? A. Prayer is an offering up of our desires unto God, in the name of Christ, by the help of his Spirit; with confession of our sins (Ps. 32:5-6), and thankful acknowledgment of his mercies.
