This creed traditionally dates back to the early 2nd century.

The word "catholic" means "universal", meaning the one true church made up of all believers in Jesus Christ from every tribe, language, people and nation.

The Gloria Patri's first line was sung in the church as early as the 2nd century to affirm that God is Triune. The second line was added in the 4th century to emphasize the eternal Deity of Jesus, refuting the Arian heresy that Jesus was not eternally God.

- White Horse, 19.11-21
- White Throne, 20.1-21.8

Overview

- 6.1-8: an indefinite period of time before the 2nd Coming
- The Four Horsemen (of the Apocalypse) represent conquest, war, famine, death
- Note the four horse figure comes from Zechariah 1.8 and 6.1-8: God rules the world
- What is described happened during the time of the Roman Empire and down through history including today
- No matter what happens in this world, our hope is in God and the promise of a new world
- Our confidence is in the Lamb who was slain being in control (He opens the seals)
- Angelic assistants: involved in world history; we are not aware

Book of Joel: helps prepare us, especially chapter 2, and within that verses 30-31; also look at II Peter 3.1-12, especially verses 11-12

- Seal 1: The white horse, 6.1-2
 - Conquest (some parallel with Jesus on the white horse in 19.11 but probably not)
 - Throughout history, empires and nations' have had conquest; cf. The 24/7 news
- Seal 2: The red horse, 6.3-4
 - Slaughter; Fire of God's judgment, blood shed
- Seal 3: Black Horse, 6.5-6
 - Famine: Exorbitant prices: A day's wages would buy only wheat for a day; Barley-lower quality, cheaper
- Seal 4: Pale Horse (chloros-pale green (death)), 6.7-8
 - Death with the abode of the dead
 - o Death, famine, pestilence, wild beasts, Ezekiel 14.21
 - o Warming up to final judgment: only 1/4 of the earth
- Seal 5: The Cry of the Martyrs, 6.9-11
 - Martyrs should give us pause
 - O What happens to God's people while this is going on?
 - o Poignant cry: How long?

- Cry for justice that emanates from God's throne
 - Want God's justice fully brought to bear and all evil eliminated
- White robe: reminder of victory and purity/righteousness
- More martyrs to come
- Seal 6: Great Day of Wrath a.k.a. The Second Coming, 6.12-17
 - Jesus returns in Luke 21.25-27 and Mark 13.24-26 immediately following the sun, moon and stars phenomena
 - Earthquake: God's presence brings earthquake; Exodus 19.18, Isaiah 29.6
 - Sun darkened, moon like blood, Cf. Mark 13.6-8; the shaking of the old creation in preparation for the new creation; Revelation 21.1; II Peter 2.10-14; Matthew 24.29-30; Isaiah 13.10; cf. Joel 2
 - Seven types of people in 6.15: complete judgment
 - Status won't matter
 - People flee like Adam and Eve
 - Day of wrath: who can stand
 - What about the wrath of God? The wrath of the Lamb?
 - God's just anger against sin and evil, cf. Genesis
- The final word for the world
- For God's people: vindication

Revelation 7

Interlude: Saint Protection, 7.1-17

- What about God's people?
 - Spiritual protection
 - o Already seen in letter to the churches that some may suffer for their faith
 - Sealed from harm, cf. Ezekiel 9.4
- Two complementary pictures: Vision of the 144,000 in 7.1-8 and the great multitude in 7.9-17
- 144,000 Vision: Links with Israelite Heritage; everybody counts
- That same 144,000 becomes a great multitude from every nation in verse 9
- This scene is AFTER the tribulation, 7.14
- Angels hold back the wind so that God's people can be sealed
 - o 144,000: Symbolic number of completeness: 12
 - The fullness of the people of God
 - The unusual listing of the tribal names: no Dan, Joseph & Manasseh rather than Ephraim & Manasseh, points to this being symbolic of completeness
 - Just Jewish believers?
 - God's work among the Jews hinted at in Romans 9-11?
 - 7.3's servants of our God would typically be Jew and Gentile believers
 - Equal statues of Gentiles with the Jews in the churches suggests that the distinction is obliterated

- Are known by God
- About the Great Multitude
 - o The crowd and the promise to Abraham, Genesis 12
 - o Palm branches are for celebration, cf. John 12.13
 - Tribulation is throughout the church age
 - "Great" points to a final culmination: intensity and finality of Christ's coming
 - White robes: victory and purity
 - o Blood of the Lamb is the cross: by faith appropriate his death for our sins
 - The victory song, 7.15-17
 - Sheltered
 - No hunger or thirst
 - Lamb at the center
 - Springs of living water
 - No more tears!
- We now anticipate Revelation 21.1ff and 22.1ff
 - But God's plans have not been fully given to us
- Seal 7: Silence in heaven, 8.1
 - We would expect the Second Coming to be the climax, but there is still another seal
 - The 7th seal will complete the journey through history
 - o Now we wait for what has been described to really him
 - o The surprise: Silence
 - Zephaniah 1.7 and Habakkuk 2.20
 - In awe of the presence of God and the impending culmination
 - o Builds tension
