- II. Hope leads to rest in our restlessness (v. 3).

## QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

- 1. What is a paradox? Can you give an example of a paradox in the Bible?
- 2. How does pride make our souls restless in a sinful way? How does humility lead us to rest in God?
- 3. What imagery does David use to describe the calmness of his soul?
- 4. What is hope? Why does David end this song by commanding us to hope in God? How does Psalm 130 help us to understand the object of this hope?
- 5. How does our rest in God relate to our restlessness for God? Can you give an example in your own life or experience?
- 6. Why is it so important for us to know both restlessness and rest in our souls?

## QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

- 1. Can I say with David, "O LORD, my heart is not lifted up; my eyes are not raised too high; I do not occupy myself with things too great and too marvelous for me"?
- 2. How does my own pride (living as if I am God) lead my soul to the storms of anger, fear, depression, etc.?
- 3. How might biblical hope teach my soul to be calm and quiet before the Lord?
- 4. Am I restless in my resting and resting in my restlessness?
