Grace in Sin City (1 Corinthians 1:4-9)

I. **Introduction**

- A. We are worn down less by the mountains we climb than with the pebble in our shoe
- B. Paul gives thanks for the very church involved in so much trouble
- C. Reading the text and outlining the sermon

II. 1 Corinthians 1:4 – I thank God always concerning you ...

- A. Paul's purpose in giving thanks for the Corinthians
 - 1. It is more than mere convention
 - 2. It is not a ploy to butter them up before lowering the boom
 - 3. Notice how he does *not* thank them (compared to other churches)
 - a. Romans 1:8
 - b. Ephesian 1:15-16
 - c. 2 Thessalonians 1:3-4
 - 4. His use of passive verbs emphasize God's work, not theirs
 - a. The problems of the church are best dealt with by making much of Christ!

III. 1 Corinthians 1:5-9 - What is Paul thankful for?

- A. Past grace (1 Corinthians 1:5-6)
 - 1. in everything
 - 2. in all utterance and knowledge
 - a. though these were the cause of their divisions, they were nevertheless gifts from God
 - b. Paul's solution is not to teach cessation of the gifts
 - 3. even as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you (v. 6)
 - a. the gifts of utterance and knowledge confirmed that God was at work in the Gospel in Corinth
 - b. but manifestations are not always a confirmation of the Gospel
- B. Present grace (1 Corinthians 1:7)
 - 1. a church that is actively using their gifts
 - a. 1 Corinthians 12:1-27
 - b. God's gifts to the church are a sign of continuing grace
 - c. Some examples of God's continuing grace with us
 - 2. eagerly waiting for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ
 - a. 1 Corinthians 15:20-26
- C. Future grace (1 Corinthians 1:8-9)
 - 1. the day of the Lord a day of judgment and vindication
 - a. What will it be for you? A day of fear or joy?
 - b. Amos 5:18-20 vs. Joel 2:31-32
 - 2. confirmed to the end that you may be blameless ...
 - a. Ps 37:17, 28, Ro 14:14, 2Co 1:21, 1Th 3:13
- D. 1 Corinthians 1:9 The faithfulness of God to keep you!
 - 1. It is God who calls you with an irresistible summons and it is He who will keep you (Rom 8:28-30, Jd 24-25)
