#### Lord's Day 46; Jeremiah 31:1-17

Introduction

- I. The address of the Lord's Prayer teaches us that our prayers must be governed by the true knowledge of God, Who is our Father.
- II. Our consideration of the address of the Lord's Prayer, at the occasion of baptism, teaches us (adults and our children) about the relationship we have with God.

# Praying to Our Heavenly Father

## I. Our Loving Father

A. God is our Father and we are His children because of the wonder of adoption.

B. Our Father is an amazing Father because He perfectly, faithfully, and constantly loves us (Jer. 31:1-3, 9).

## II. Our Strong Confidence

A. Knowing God in truth, as Father, gives to us the right confidence in Him.

B. It is in this confidence that we go to our Father in prayer. This sets the tone for everything else Jesus teaches us to pray in the Lord's Prayer.

#### iii. Our Humble Reverence

- A. Our Father is Almighty God. He is our Father who must be honored and worshiped.
- B. In our prayers, we must remember that we are to stand in awe of Him.
