# Job 19:1 (KJV) <sup>1</sup> Then Job answered and said, Job 19:1 (TEV) <sup>1</sup> Job Why do you keep tormenting me with words?

#### Job 19:1 (NIV) <sup>1</sup> Then Job replied:



#### Job 19:2 (KJV)

<sup>2</sup> How long will ye vex my soul, and break me in pieces with words?

# Job 19:2 (NIV)

<sup>2</sup> "How long will you torment me and crush me with words?



# <u>Job 19:3</u> (KJV)

<sup>3</sup> These ten times have ye reproached me: ye are not ashamed *that* ye make yourselves strange to me. Job 19:3 (TEV)

<sup>3</sup> Time after time you insult me and show no shame for the way you abuse me.

#### Job 19:3 (NIV)

<sup>3</sup> Ten times now you have reproached me; shamelessly you attack me.



#### Job 19:4 (KJV)

<sup>4</sup> And be it indeed *that* I have erred, mine error remaineth with myself.

Job 19:4 (TEV)

<sup>4</sup> Even if I have done wrong, how does that hurt you? Job 19:4 (NIV)

<sup>4</sup> If it is true that I have gone astray, my error remains my concern alone.



# Job 19:5 (KJV)

<sup>5</sup> If indeed ye will magnify *yourselves* against me, and plead against me my reproach: Job 19:5 (TEV)

<sup>5</sup> You think you are better than I am, and regard my troubles as proof of my guilt. Job 19:5 (NIV)

<sup>5</sup> If indeed you would exalt yourselves above me and use my humiliation against me,




#### Job 19:6 (KJV)

<sup>6</sup> Know now that God hath overthrown me, and hath compassed me with his net. Job 19:6 (TEV)

<sup>6</sup> Can't you see it is God who has done this? He has set a trap to catch me.

#### Job 19:6 (NIV)

<sup>6</sup> then know that God has wronged me and drawn his net around me.



# Job 19:7 (KJV)

<sup>7</sup> Behold, I cry out of wrong, but I am not heard: I cry aloud, but *there is* no judgment.
Job 19:7 (TEV)

<sup>7</sup> I protest his violence, but no one is listening; no one hears my cry for justice. Job 19:7 (NIV)

<sup>7</sup> "Though I cry, 'I've been wronged!' I get no response; though I call for help, there is no justice.



# <u>Job 19:8</u> (KJV)


<sup>8</sup> He hath fenced up my way that I cannot pass, and he hath set darkness in my paths.

# Job 19:8 (TEV)

<sup>8</sup> God has blocked the way, and I can't get through; he has hidden my path in darkness.

#### Job 19:8 (NIV)

<sup>8</sup> He has blocked my way so I cannot pass; he has shrouded my paths in darkness.



# <u>Job 19:9</u> (KJV)

<sup>9</sup> He hath stripped me of my glory, and taken the crown *from* my head.

# Job 19:9 (TEV)

<sup>9</sup> He has taken away all my wealth and destroyed my reputation.

#### Job 19:9 (NIV)

<sup>9</sup> He has stripped me of my honor and removed the crown from my head.




# <u>Job 19:10</u> (KJV)

<sup>10</sup> He hath destroyed me on every side, and I am gone: and mine hope hath he removed like a tree. Job 19:10 (TEV)

<sup>10</sup> He batters me from every side. He uproots my hope and leaves me to wither and die. Job 19:10 (NIV)

<sup>10</sup> He tears me down on every side till I am gone; he uproots my hope like a tree.



# <u>Job 19:11</u> (KJV)


<sup>11</sup> He hath also kindled his wrath against me, and he counteth me unto him as one of his enemies.
Job 19:11 (TEV)

<sup>11</sup> God is angry and rages against me; he treats me like

his worst enemy.

#### Job 19:11 (NIV)

<sup>11</sup> His anger burns against me; he counts me among his enemies.




# <u>Job 19:12</u> (KJV)

<sup>12</sup> His troops come together, and raise up their way against me, and encamp round about my tabernacle. Job 19:12 (TEV)

<sup>12</sup> He sends his army to attack me; they dig trenches and lay siege to my tent.

# Job 19:12 (NIV)

<sup>12</sup> His troops advance in force; they build a siege ramp against me and encamp around my tent.



# <u>Job 19:13</u> (KJV)

<sup>13</sup> He hath put my brethren far from me, and mine acquaintance are verily estranged from me. Job 19:13 (TEV)

<sup>13</sup> God has made my own family forsake me; I am a stranger to those who knew me; Job 19:13 (NIV)

<sup>13</sup> "He has alienated my brothers from me; my acquaintances are completely estranged from me.



#### <u>Job 19:14</u> (KJV)

<sup>14</sup> My kinsfolk have failed, and my familiar friends have

#### forgotten me.

# Job 19:14 (TEV)

<sup>14</sup> my relatives and friends are gone.

# Job 19:14 (NIV)

<sup>14</sup> My kinsmen have gone away; my friends have forgotten me.




#### Job 19:15 (KJV)

<sup>15</sup> They that dwell in mine house, and my maids, count me for a stranger: I am an alien in their sight. Job 19:15 (TEV)

<sup>15</sup> Those who were guests in my house have forgotten me; my servant women treat me like a stranger and a foreigner. Job 19:15 (NIV)

<sup>15</sup> My guests and my maidservants count me a stranger; they look upon me as an alien.



# Job 19:16 (KJV)


<sup>16</sup> I called my servant, and he gave *me* no answer; I intreated him with my mouth.

# <u>Job 19:16</u> (TEV)

<sup>16</sup> When I call a servant, he doesn't answer— even when I beg him to help me.

# Job 19:16 (NIV)

<sup>16</sup> I summon my servant, but he does not answer, though I beg him with my own mouth.




# <u>Job 19:17</u> (KJV)

<sup>17</sup> My breath is strange to my wife, though I intreated for the children's *sake* of mine own body. Job 19:17 (TEV)

<sup>17</sup> My wife can't stand the smell of my breath, and my own brothers won't come near me. Job 19:17 (NIV)

<sup>17</sup> My breath is offensive to my wife; I am loathsome to my own brothers.




#### <u>Job 19:18</u> (KJV)

<sup>18</sup> Yea, young children despised me; I arose, and they spake against me.

# Job 19:18 (TEV)

<sup>18</sup> Children despise me and laugh when they see me. Job 19:18 (NIV)

<sup>18</sup> Even the little boys scorn me; when I appear, they ridicule me.




# <u>Job 19:19</u> (KJV)

<sup>19</sup> All my inward friends abhorred me: and they whom I loved are turned against me.
Job 19:19 (TEV)

<sup>19</sup> My closest friends look at me with disgust; those I loved most have turned against me. Job 19:19 (NIV)

<sup>19</sup> All my intimate friends detest me; those I love have turned against me.




# <u>Job 19:20</u> (KJV)

<sup>20</sup> My bone cleaveth to my skin and to my flesh, and I am escaped with the skin of my teeth.
Job 19:20 (TEV)

<sup>20</sup> My skin hangs loose on my bones; I have barely escaped with my life.

#### <u>Job 19:20</u> (NIV)

<sup>20</sup> I am nothing but skin and bones; I have escaped with only the skin of my teeth.



# <u>Job 19:21</u> (KJV)

<sup>21</sup> Have pity upon me, have pity upon me, O ye my friends; for the hand of God hath touched me. Job 19:21 (TEV)

<sup>21</sup> You are my friends! Take pity on me! The hand of God has struck me down.

# Job 19:21 (NIV)

<sup>21</sup> "Have pity on me, my friends, have pity, for the hand of God has struck me.



## <u>Job 19:22</u> (KJV)

<sup>22</sup> Why do ye persecute me as God, and are not satisfied with my flesh? Job 19:22 (TEV)

<sup>22</sup> Why must you persecute me the way God does?
Haven't you tormented me enough?
Job 19:22 (NIV)

<sup>22</sup> Why do you pursue me as God does? Will you never get enough of my flesh?




# Job 19:23 (KJV)

<sup>23</sup> Oh that my words were now written! oh that they were printed in a book!
Job 19:23 (TEV)

<sup>23</sup> How I wish that someone would remember my words and record them in a book!

#### Job 19:23 (NIV)

<sup>23</sup> "Oh, that my words were recorded, that they were written on a scroll,




# <u>Job 19:24</u> (KJV)

<sup>24</sup> That they were graven with an iron pen and lead in the rock for ever! Job 19:24 (TEV)

<sup>24</sup> Or with a chisel carve my words in stone and write them so that they would last forever. Job 19:24 (NIV)

<sup>24</sup> that they were inscribed with an iron tool on lead, or engraved in rock forever!



# <u>Job 19:25</u> (KJV)


<sup>25</sup> For I know *that* my redeemer liveth, and *that* he shall stand at the latter *day* upon the earth:
Job 19:25 (TEV)

<sup>25</sup> But I know there is someone in heaven who will come

#### at last to my defense.

# Job 19:25 (NIV)

<sup>25</sup> I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand upon the earth.



# <u>Job 19:26</u> (KJV)

<sup>26</sup> And *though* after my skin *worms* destroy this *body*, yet in my flesh shall I see God:
Job 19:26 (TEV)

<sup>26</sup> Even after my skin is eaten by disease, while still in this body I will see God.

#### <u>Job 19:26</u> (NIV)

<sup>26</sup> And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God;



#### Job 19:27 (KJV)

<sup>27</sup> Whom I shall see for myself, and mine eyes shall behold, and not another; *though* my reins be consumed within me. Job 19:27 (TEV)

<sup>27</sup> I will see him with my own eyes, and he will not be a stranger. My courage failed because you said, Job 19:27 (NIV)

<sup>27</sup> I myself will see him with my own eyes--I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!




#### Job 19:28 (KJV)

<sup>28</sup> But ye should say, Why persecute we him, seeing the root of the matter is found in me?
Job 19:28 (TEV)

<sup>28</sup> "How can we torment him?" You looked for some excuse to attack me.

#### Job 19:28 (NIV)

<sup>28</sup> "If you say, 'How we will hound him, since the root of the trouble lies in him,'



#### Job 19:29 (KJV)

<sup>29</sup> Be ye afraid of the sword: for wrath *bringeth* the punishments of the sword, that ye may know *there is* a judgment. Job 19:29 (TEV)

<sup>29</sup> But now, be afraid of the sword— the sword that brings God's wrath on sin, so that you will know there is one who judges. Job 19:29 (NIV)

<sup>29</sup> you should fear the sword yourselves; for wrath will bring punishment by the sword, and then you will know that there is judgment."
