Romans 12:10-16 – we are to LOVE one another as FAMILY – (Hebrews 13:1... Matthew 25:40... John 13:35

Romans 15:5-7 – we are to PLEASE one another... be LIKE-MINDED, and RECEIVE one another... just as Christ *"received" (accepted; welcomed)* us...

Romans 15:14 – we are to ADMONISH one another – this involves biblical confrontation in order to promote biblical change – 1 Thessalonians 5:14... 2 Thessalonians 3:6-15

1 Corinthians 12:12-27 -

<u>Uniformity</u> – having the same form...

<u>Unity</u> – 'a condition of harmony...

<u>Diversity</u> – 'the condition of having or being composed of differing elements: variety...

(4th) In Loyal Submission to GOD'S WORD – (1:30)... 2 Timothy 3:16-17
