

"Christ's Kingdom Comes to the Most Unlikely" Pastor Doug Warren

Acts 8: 26 - 40

²⁶ Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." This is a desert place. ²⁷ And he rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸ and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹ And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot." ³⁰ So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹ And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. ³² Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this:

"Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he opens not his mouth.

33 In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth."

³⁴ And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵ Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶ And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" ³⁸ And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him. ³⁹ And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰ But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he preached the gospel to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.



The State Parks people have told us that we will have to wear masks and maintain social distancing. To keep people as safe as possible the picnic tables and benches have been removed from all state parks, so people attending the picnic will have to bring their own chairs or blankets to sit on. Use of bathrooms will be limited and they also suggest that you bring bottles of water to drink.

Christ's Kingdom Comes to the Most Unlikely

2. How Do We Understand Christ and the Prophets (32-35)?

3. Eunuch's Baptism *Identifies Him* as Part of God's People(36-40).

As shocking as it was for the Kingdom of God to be extended to the Samaritans, it is even more staggering to consider it including someone like the rich Ethiopian eunuch. How is that possible?! As Isaiah gave witness to long ago, the whole mission of the gospel runs counter to our mistaken idea of how the world works. Jesus has come as the suffering servant to redeem an irredeemable people and to gather rebels from every nation into the Kingdom of Christ. What are you doing to give Him praise?

and let not the eunuch say, "Behold, I am a dry tree."

For thus says the Lord: "To the eunuchs who keep my Sabbaths,

I will give them an everlasting name that shall not be cut off."

Second Corinthians 1: 18 - 22

Sunday Morning

READ Acts 8:26-40; Zephaniah 3:9-13; Isaiah 56:3-5. DISCUSS, How does the Ethiopian eunuch fit in the story of Acts? What is God doing? Why? What role does Philip serve? What role do you? PRAY for Christ to open our eyes of faith to His faithful fulfillment of His promises. Ask the Holy Spirit to open our eyes to God's purposes.

Sunday Evening

In lieu of the evening worship service tonight, please set apart some time to pray for God to bring revival here at FCCW and around the globe.

Monday

READ Acts 8:26-40; Isaiah 53:1-12; 2 Corinthians 1:18-22. DISCUSS, How is Jesus described in Isaiah 53? How has God done what He promised? How is His faithfulness applied to us? PRAY, "Lord Jesus, thank You for Your faithfulness. By Your Holy Spirit help us to rest in Your faithfulness as You make us faithful too."

Tuesday

READ Acts 8:26-40; Isaiah 54:1-17; Jeremiah 31:31-40. DISCUSS, What is the relationship between the suffering servant in Isaiah 53 and the new covenant in 54? How do these things point to Christ? How are we seeing that unfolding in Acts? PRAY, "Lord, thank You for Your covenant. Thank You for your covenant faithfulness. Teach us to walk in Your ways. Guide us, Holy Spirit."

Wednesday

READ Acts 8:26-40; Isaiah 55:1-13; Romans 2:1-4. DISCUSS, What is the relationship between the suffering servant in Isaiah 53 and the new creation in 55? How do these things point to Christ? What does it mean for us to forsake our way? What does repentance involve? PRAY, "Lord, You're merciful. Teach us to seek You and Your ways. Enable us to follow You."

Thursday

READ Acts 8:26-40; Isaiah 56:1-12; Ephesians 2:11-22. DISCUSS, What is the relationship between the suffering servant in Isaiah 53 and the blessing in 56? How can this blessing belong even to foreigners and eunuchs? How has Jesus accomplished this? PRAY, "Lord, You alone are King of Kings. Make our hearts delight in praising You and longing for Your return."

Friday

READ Acts 8:26-40; Isaiah 53:1-12; 2 Corinthians 1:18-22. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? REJOICE if Christ has given you the honor to be identified among His people! PRAY for renewal and revival across our land.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow. There will be both the live-stream and in-person services available.

READ Acts 9:1-43; Matthew 25:31-46. Invite others to join you for either the *live-stream or in-person service* tomorrow. Ask Jesus to help us in the transition back to gathered worship in the building.
