1 Corinthians 7:25 (NASB) Now concerning virgins I have no command of the Lord, but I give an opinion as one who by the mercy of

the Lord is trustworthy.

- "Now concerning" is *peri de:* new topic
- "No command" implies no binding revelation on this matter
- Paul's opinion is an informed one which he believes will be to their advantage


Paul's Advice: Remain as You Are

1 Corinthians 7:26 (NASB)

I think then that this is good in view of the present distress, that it is good for a man to remain as he is.

- There is much discussion about the nature of "present distress" (or 'present crisis')
- Is this about 'eschatological woes' or a temporary crisis such as a famine?
- The last days cover the church age but there are severe situations within that age


