Many of God's specific predictions have been fulfilled literally, with perfect accuracy. Therefore, you can trust when God's word addresses future things.

_____ Accuracy

The stories told in the Bible are not fables or myths. The people are real. The places are real. These events really took place. Archeology has confirmed the historical accuracy of many details as told in Scripture. Therefore, you can trust when God's word addresses truths which cannot be empirically verified.
