Prelude

Call to Worship

This psalm juxtaposes God's transcendent greatness with His willingness to minister to the lowliest of Human beings, a quality He values in His people, as we shall see today.

Psalm 113 ESV

- Praise the LORD!
 - Praise, O servants of the LORD, praise the name of the LORD!
- ² Blessed be the name of the LORD from this time forth and forevermore!
- ³ From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the LORD is to be praised!
- ⁴The LORD is high above all nations, and his glory above the heavens!
- ⁵ Who is like the LORD our God, who is seated on high,
- 6 who looks far down on the heavens and the earth?
- ⁷ He raises the poor from the dust
 - and lifts the needy from the ash heap,
- ⁸ to make them sit with princes, with the princes of his people.
- ⁹ He gives the barren woman a home, making her the joyous mother of children. Praise the LORD!

Prayer of Adoration and Invocation

* Hymn of Praise

In our opening hymn we praise God for giving His Word, through which is mediated to us eternal life.

* Reading from the Law

You are probably among those who accept God's Word as being true, but do you tremble at it? This is a question well worth pondering.

Isaiah 66:1, 2 ESV

¹Thus says the LORD:

"Heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool; what is the house that you would build for me, and what is the place of my rest?

All these things my hand has made, and so all these things came to be, declares the LORD.
But this is the one to whom I will look: he who is humble and contrite in spirit and trembles at my word.

Silent Confession of Sin Corporate Confession of Sin

At first glance, the psalmist in this passage seems to be celebrating the fact that He always keeps God's commandments, but a closer examination reveals His acknowledgement of sin ("Turn my heart") and his appeal to/hope in God for salvation, which only sinners need. The emphasis on obedience amplifies the expression of true confession and repentance, which always involve a determined desire and effort to obey God's law.

Responsive reading, Psalm 119:33-56

(Trinity Hymnal pgs. 829-30)

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

God's Word asserts, first, that all are sinners; second, that all who confess their sins (which includes repentance) are forgiven; third, that deliverance from sin includes cleansing from sin as well as pardon, so that we "walk in the light" and have fellowship with God, which is the purpose for which we are saved at all.

I John 1:5-9 ESV

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. 6 If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. 7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. 8 If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Distribution of Elements

For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.
