Discussion Questions

The following questions are designed to be used by parents in discussing the sermon with their children, but can be used by anyone in discussing the sermon with others:

- 1. What stood out to you in this sermon? Why?
- 2. What did Peter do in the book of Acts?
- 3. How did Peter show courage in this passage?
- 4. What does it mean that Peter denied Christ?
- 5. If Peter had confessed that he was Christ's disciple, what cost might Peter have had to pay?
- 6. How does this passage picture what Jesus said in verse 38, "The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak"?
- 7. How did Christ restore Peter?

Going Deeper:

These questions are designed for the believer to use in prayer with his/her Lord, and in discussion with brothers and sisters in the Lord:

- 1. How did this sermon challenge your thinking, or grow your understanding?
- 2. How did Peter earlier sow the seeds of his failure in this passage? Have you been sowing the same seeds? Explain.
- 3. Have you ever denied Christ or been ashamed of Him? If so, has this been a humbling experience? Explain.
- 4. What is the difference between worldly grief over sin, and godly grief over sin (2 Cor 7:10)?
- 5. Have you ever wept over your sin? Explain.
- 6. How did the Lord use Peter's experience in this passage for Peter's growth and equipping?
- 7. How does the Lord intend to use your past spiritual failures for your growth and equipping?
- 8. What is the primary way you should be affected by this passage this week?
