When he opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God and for the witness they had borne. ¹⁰ They cried out with a loud voice, "O Sovereign Lord, holy and true, how long before you will judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell on the earth?" ¹¹ Then they were each given a white robe and told to rest a little longer, until the number of their fellow servants and their brothers^[C] should be complete, who were to be killed as they themselves had been.

¹² When he opened the sixth seal, I looked, and behold, there was a great earthquake, and the sun became black as sackcloth, the full moon became like blood, ¹³ and the stars of the sky fell to the earth as the fig tree sheds its winter fruit when shaken by a gale. ¹⁴ The sky vanished like a scroll that is being rolled up, and every mountain and island was removed from its place. ¹⁵ Then the kings of the earth and the great ones and the generals and the rich and the powerful, and everyone, slave^[d] and free, hid themselves in the caves and among the rocks of the mountains, ¹⁶ calling to the mountains and rocks, "Fall on us and hide us from the face of him who is seated on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb, ¹⁷ for the great day of their wrath has come, and who can stand?"

Two Great Cries

The Fifth Seal, 9-11

- Response to the suffering brought about by the first four seals
- This seal is opened at the same time as the other four seals
- Who
 - Souls
 - Beneath the altar
 - John sees the two altars at the temple, one for sacrifice, the other for incense, as one altar in heaven
 - Where the sacrificial blood was poured and "life" resulted
 - Their loved ones who have died for the faith are still alive! And they are with Christ
 - Faithful to God and willing to die for him
 - Martyrs, but actually represent all of God's people
 - Like Jesus, their sufferings advance the work of the kingdom.
 - The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the church- Tertullian
- Their cry
 - Cry for justice that emanates from God's throne
 - Want God's justice fully brought to bear and all evil eliminated
 - The church does not escape persecution
 - It endures and perseveres
 - Not because they are selfish... but rather they are in tune with God
 - They want God to be glorified
- The answer
 - A white robe- represents victory and purity
 - They are to rest... trust God
 - The martyrs yet to be
 - o Being in the center of God's plan may include martyrdom

The Sixth Seal, 12-17

- Jesus returns in Luke 21.25-27 and Mark 13.24-26 immediately following the sun, moon and stars phenomena
- The catastrophes of nature indicate what is to come

- Earthquakes prominent in the first century in Asia Minor
- O Here, a great earthquake... the sun... the moon...
 - Joel 2.31; 2.1; Isaiah 34.4
 - Matthew 24.29
 - Sun darkened, moon like blood, Cf. Mark 13.6-8; the shaking of the old creation in preparation for the new creation; Revelation 21.1; II Peter 2.10-14; Matthew 24.29-30; Isaiah 13.10; cf. Joel 2
- Sun and moon no longer the source of light... God is
 - Sun darkened, moon like blood, Cf. Mark 13.6-8; the shaking of the old creation in preparation for the new creation; Revelation 21.1; II Peter 2.10-14; Matthew 24.29-30; Isaiah 13.10; cf. Joel 2
- o That atmosphere which makes the sky look blue is rolled up, cf Isaiah
- o Even the mountains...
- These natural upheavals... indicate the picture of terror and dread coming for unbelievers
- The second coming/day of judgment
 - This is the first of seven descriptions of the second coming that we will have in Revelation
 - Wake up call... judgment is coming... and no one will escape
 - The ones who hide
 - Jesus is the great king we are reminded in the call to worship
 - Seven types of people- complete judgment
 - The great day indicates complete judgment as well
 - o They flee and hide rather than repent
 - Seven types of people in 6.15: complete judgment
 - Status won't matter
 - People flee like Adam and Eve
 - The wrath of God and the Lamb
 - Yes, Jesus... Romans 2.16 and John 5.27
- Who can stand?
 - Note: the question is not "will I survive the trouble that lies in this world?" But "will I survive the judgment of the Lamb?"
 - God's just anger against sin and evil, cf. Genesis
 - The final word for the world
 - For God's people: vindication

So What About Us?

- The answer
 - Only those who repent and believe
 - o Maintain our hope in God
 - The Lord's Table
