

## Mark 6:7-13 – Shake Off the Dust

<sup>7</sup> And He called the twelve to *Himself*, and began to send them out two *by* two, and gave them power over unclean spirits. <sup>8</sup> He commanded them to take nothing for the journey except a staff—no bag, no bread, no copper in *their* money belts—<sup>9</sup> but to wear sandals, and not to put on two tunics. <sup>10</sup> Also He said to them, “In whatever place you enter a house, stay there till you depart from that place. <sup>11</sup> And whoever will not receive you nor hear you, when you depart from there, shake off the dust under your feet as a testimony against them. Assuredly, I say to you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom and Gomorrah in the day of judgment than for that city!” <sup>12</sup> So they went out and preached that *people* should repent. <sup>13</sup> And they cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick, and healed *them*.
