The Defense of Tyre


The City and Citadel of Tyre


From Isaiah's days as a prophet (approx. 740-700 BC) until 332 BC, Tyre was attacked five times. Assyria, Babylon and Persia all tried unsuccessfully to get rid of the menace of Tyre's meddling in political and economic affairs. The city on the coast was destroyed multiple times while its inhabitants would simply evacuate to the island citadel. Against land-based armies, this island defense seemed impenetrable. Then Alexander the Great came along.

Alexander, in 332, destroyed the city of Tyre and used the destroyed material from it to build a 200 foot causeway out to the island. He then drew his siege engines (the tallest in the history of war) across the causeway and besieged the city. It is estimated that while many Tyrians were evacuated by sea to Carthage, still 8,000 died and 30,000 were sold into slavery. Alexander lost only 400 troops. To this day, the citadel of Tyre rests on a peninsula rather than on an island due to Alexander's construction!
