# A Prayer of Desperation (Psalm 28)

To Read:

- 1. Luke 18:1-14
- 2. Luke 11:1-13

#### **Proposition:**

David's situation led him to pray desperately, needing God to save - an attitude that should mark us as well and we can have confidence in Christ that God will save.

#### A Prayer of Desperation

- A Desperate Plea God, please answer me or I will die
  - O David's activity: earnestly seeking God's salvation
  - O David's request: hear me! answer me!
  - ●●○ David's desperation: if God won't answer, I'm as good as dead
- A Burning Desire God, don't count me among the wicked
  - David's desire: don't count me among the wicked
  - ●●● David's desire: don't judge me as a hypocrite
- A Foundational Hope God will judge righteously for His own glory
  - O David's plea: God, be just! (according to)
  - David's reason: the wicked don't honor you
  - David's conviction: God will judge for His own glory
- A Joyful Confidence God has heard my cry
  - O David's confidence: God has heard my cry
  - David's God: The Lord is my strength and shield
  - ❷❶○ David's joy: Blessed be the Lord!
- A Communal Prayer God, be the Savior of Your people
  - David's communal confidence: God is the Savior of His people
  - David's communal prayer: God be the Savior and Shepherd of Your people

### The Ultimate Prayer

- 102 An Unexplained Tension tension between verses 3+4, either self-righteous or unresolvable (pleas for mercy, not justice)
- An Earnest Supplicant the prayer of desperation
  - O Psalm 28:1-2
  - Luke 3:21, Mark 1:35, Luke 5:16, Luke 6:12, Matthew 14:23, Luke 9:18, Luke 9:28-29, Luke 11:1, Luke 22:41-44, Hebrews 5:7
- Offer make My grave with the wicked, instead of theirs
  - Opening Property 10 to 10 t
  - **X**o Isaiah 53:8-9, Luke 22:41-42, II Corinthians 5:21
- A Unifying Act God will be the righteous judge in Me
  - O Psalm 28:4-5
  - Romans 5:9, II Corinthians 5:21, Romans 3:23-26
- A Joyful Confidence God has heard my cry
  - Psalm 28:6-7
  - Hebrews 5:7, John 12:27, Hebrews 12:2
- • A Communal Answer I will be the Shepherd of God's people
  - Psalm 28:8-9
    - o John 10:11-18, Hebrews 13:20-21

## Praying with Desperation

- We must have a desperate plea
  - O David and ultimately Jesus called out desperately to God, knowing their need for His aid Psalm 28:1-2
    - o Jesus called us to follow His pattern of prayer Luke 18:1, Luke 21:36
  - O An earnest pattern of prayer is the patter of the NT Romans 12:12, Colossians 4:2, I Thessalonians 5:17
  - And the attitude of our earnest prayers should be a desperation for God II Corinthians 1:8-11
- We must have a burning desire
  - David's desire was to be counted righteous Psalm 28:3
  - ① This should be our desire in Christ as well Philippians 3:7-11
- We must have a foundational hope
  - David's hope was that God would be just Psalm 28:4-5
  - Our hope must be the same in Christ I John 1:9
  - And this is our hope through all the trials of this world II Thessalonians 1:6
- We must have a joyful, thankful confidence
  - O David end's his prayer with confidence and joy that God has heard him Psalm 28:6-7
    - o We are called to have confidence in prayer as well Mark 11:20-25, James 1:6
    - o Our confidence is merely believing Jesus' promises John 6:37, I John 5:14-15
  - Our believing confidence should lead to thankful joy Romans 12:12, I Thessalonians 5:16
- We must have a communal prayer
  - David's final prayer was that God would ultimately save His people through His anointed one; a prayer that was answered in Christ Psalm 28:8-9
  - 📵 o Our focus in prayer should also end, not with ourselves, but with all of God's people Ephesians 6:18
