Two Imperatives

1 Corinthians 3:18 (CSB)

Let no one deceive himself. If anyone among you thinks he is wise in this age, let him become a fool so that he can become wise.

- Self-deception is grounded in "this age"
- The protasis (if anyone) is a condition of the 1st class, assumed to be true
- The 2nd imperative gives the only way out

This Age of Deception

1 Corinthians 3:18a (CSB)

Let no one deceive himself. If anyone among you thinks he is wise in this age...

- Self-deception is based on false thinking
- Self-deception rejects God's wisdom which is always at odds with the world's
- This age is temporary
- This age is under God's wrath
- This age believes "the lie" of Satan

Paul's Purpose Clause

1 Corinthians 3:18b (CSB)

...let him become a fool so that he can become wise.

- The second imperative is a call to believe the gospel
- The "wise" are those who reject the lie and embrace the Truth!
- God's wisdom is "the word of the cross"
- The option to please Christ and the world does not exist

God's Wisdom Is Not From Man

1 Corinthians 3:19 (CSB)

For the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God, since it is written, He catches the wise in their craftiness;

- This theme was introduced in 1:18-25
- God's wisdom is "the word of the cross"
- Man's wisdom is religious works

The Futile Reasonings of Human Religion

1 Corinthians 3:20 (CSB)

and again, The Lord knows that the reasonings of the wise are futile.

- "Reasonings" is dialogismos (14 times NT)
- Futile "reasonings" are known by Christ (Lk 5:22; Lk 6:8; Lk 9:46, 47; Lk 24:38)
- Paul rebukes futile reasoning (Rom. 1:21)

Implications and Applications

- The religion of man is based on 'the lie' and cannot be pleasing to God
- The world believes the lie; but we are called to believe the truth and be saved.
- There is no valid process whereby the wisdom of God will become popular with the world

The Suppression of the Truth

Romans 1:18 (NASB)

For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness

- God's wrath against sin shows the need for salvation (Romans 1:16, 17)
- No one can change reality through semantic manipulation!

The Wicked Exchange

Romans 1:25 (NKJV)

who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen.

- Satan is the father of the lie (John 8:44; Genesis 3:3-7)
- The lie "you surely will not die" persists
- Jesus Christ is the truth and speaks the truth (John 8:45)

The World Is Hostile to God

Romans 8:7, 8 (CSB)

The mindset of the flesh is hostile to God because it does not submit to God's law. Indeed, it is unable to do so. Those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

- This hostility is not resolved through 'church growth,' but conversion
- Boasting is excluded (Romans 3:27;1 Corinthians 3:21)
