Philippians 3:1-3

Watchful Rejoicing

1. Jesus Is the Source of Our Joy (1a).

2. False Confidence Steals This Joy (1b-2).

3. Rejoice in Christ—Worship by Spirit, Glory in Jesus, Brag Not in Flesh (3).

CONCLUSION: Do you struggle to rejoice? How are we to obey God's command to rejoice in Christ? We have seen how the completed work of Jesus is all that we need for a lifetime of abundant, overflowing, contagious joy. We also know that God's enemies are intent on robbing us of that joy. It is imperative that we continue together worshipping Christ by the Holy Spirit, finding our glory in Jesus, and refusing all temptations to boast in the flesh. Let us pledge anew to faithfully rejoice in Christ together in these godly ways! Amen.

Luke 6:20-23

20 And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said:

"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.

21 "Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you shall be satisfied.

"Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh.

22 "Blessed are you when people hate you and when they exclude you and revile you and spurn your name as evil, on account of the Son of Man! 23 Rejoice in that day, and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in heaven; for so their fathers did to the prophets.

Taking Gathered Worship Home

One of the critical differences Christianity is to make in our daily lives is learning by the Holy Spirit how to *enjoy* God's many blessings *without allowing them to become the source* of our joy. Sunday Morning

READ Philippians 3:1-3; Luke 6:20-23; Psalm 16:1-11; 28:6-9; 149:1-9; John 10:1-11; Ephesians 6:10-17. DISCUSS How are you (we) celebrating in Christ today? What is our certainty? Why? What provides you confidence today and hope for tomorrow? PRAY "Jesus, thank You for blessing us so greatly with Your steadfast love. You are faithful to all Your promises forever."

Sunday Evening

Monday

READ **Philippians 3:1-3**; **Luke 6:20-23**; **Psalm 149:1-9**. DISCUSS What victory are God's people to be celebrating joyfully? How has Jesus accomplished this victory? How certain are we of it? SERVE by putting someone else's interest *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Philippians 1:6**. PRAY, "Lord, thank You for all Your tender care, protection, and cultivation. Make us fruitful and grateful to You."

Tuesday

READ **Philippians 3:1-3**; **1:17**; **2:3**; **John 10:1-11**. DISCUSS With whom is Jesus as the good Shepherd contrasted here? How do the enemies of God demonstrate *selfish ambition*? What care do they have for our joy? What about Christ? MEDITATE on **Philippians 1:6**. PRAY, "Lord, enable us to trust You in all things. Teach us to recognize the lie that calls Your faithfulness into question!"

Wednesday

READ **Philippians 3:1-3**; **Psalm 16:1-11**. DISCUSS How does our confidence in Christ's faithfulness lead us to rejoice? How has Christ fulfilled v. 10? How does that fuel our joy facing death? MEDITATE on **Philippians 1:6**. PRAY, "Lord, teach us to trust Your faithfulness and to rejoice in You."

Thursday

READ **Philippians 3:1-3**; **Psalm 28:6-9**; **Ephesians 6:10-17**. DISCUSS How does reliance upon Christ enable our hearts to leap for joy? How are you (we) trusting God's shepherding care today? MEDITATE on **Philippians 1:6**. PRAY, "Lord, enable us to rejoice in all things, knowing You are both *good* and *in control*. Make us to want no part of wickedness and to turn from it to You swiftly and consistently."

Friday

READ Philippians 3:1-3; Luke 6:20-23; Psalm 16:1-11; 28:6-9; 149:1-9; John 10:1-11; Ephesians 6:10-17. DISCUSS, How has God been convicting you from these passages this week? MEDITATE on John 15:4. PRAY that we at FCCW would *bless the God who has so richly blessed us in Christ*.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the service tomorrow which is *available both inperson and via live-stream*. READ **Philippians 3:1-21**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the 9:30 service. Ask Jesus to gather us together joyfully to praise Him.
