This Sunday at CMPC we take a week away from Revelation as Pastor John looks at Isaiah 33.22 and *Living in the USA*. CMPC SERMON NOTES

Sermon: "Living in the USA" Text: Isaiah 33.22

How do we view our nation?

- Are we a Christian nation? Technically correct: we are not a theocracy
- So what is the connection between Christianity and our nation?
 - Critical question for how we view our nation and hence how we are to live as God's people who are also citizens of nations.
 - Close enough so that throughout our nation's history, it has been called a "Christian" nation.
- Supreme Court Justice David Brewer (1823-1910): "Of all the nations in the world... (America is) most justly called a Christian nation (because Christianity) has so largely shaped and molded it."

Who said it...

- "The general principles on which the fathers achieved independence were... the general principles of Christianity."
- "The teachings of the Bible are so interwoven and entwined with our whole civic and social life that it would be literally... impossible for us to figure to ourselves what that life would be if these teaching were removed. America was born a Christian nation America was born to exemplify that devotion to the elements of righteousness which are derived from the revelations of Holy Scripture.»
- "American life is builded, and can alone survive, upon the] fundamental philosophy announced by the Savior nineteen centuries ago. This is a Christian Nation.'

.

- "America was born a Christian nation —America was born to exemplify that devotion to the elements of righteousness which are derived from the revelations of Holy Scripture.
- "I believe the entire Bill of Rights came into being because of the knowledge our forefathers had of the Bible and their belief in it: freedom of belief of expression, of assembly, of petition, the dignity of the individual, the sanctity of the home, equal justice under law, and the reservation of powers to the people I like to believe we are living today in the spirit of the Christian religion. I like also to believe that as long as we do so, n0o great harm can come to our country."
- "This is a Christian nation."
- 'No nation has ever existed or been governed without religion. Nor can be. The Christian religion is the best religion that has been given to man and I, as Chief Magistrate of this nation, am bound to give it the sanction of my example.

So what do we say?

- History: nation founded upon Christian principles based on Judeo-Christian worldview and ethics drawn from the Bible.
 - Our text today is one of the key verses
- Prevailing 18th Century Biblical Worldview
- Reformation worldview:
 - o a Sovereign Creator; the rule of law

Isaiah 33.22

- Judge
 - God is a just God
- Law is the basis for liberty and freedom
 - Law's purpose: restrain evil
 - Protect the poor and the alien
- King- accountability to our Creator
- A verse for the government: Three branches
 - Judicial Branch- Judge
- Legislative Branch- Lawgiver
- Executive Branch- king

Why is it needed?

- The grip of sin
- Example: Capitalism
 - o Pros:
 - Acknowledges human creativity and freedom

- Acknowledges hard work
- o Cons:
 - Distorted by greed
 - Distorted by selfishness/lack of kindness
- God Saves
