### II. Do you realize what time it is? Wake up! v. 11-12a

- A. This is no time to sleep. v. 11a
  - 1. Christians have a tendency to spiritual drowsiness. Acts 20:9
  - 2. You ought to have a great sense of urgency Heb. 9:27 Ps. 90:12 Mt. 13:24-30
- B. The day of salvation is at hand.
  - 1. Of what aspect of *salvation* is Paul speaking? v. 11b 4:5 5:1 8:1,21ff Eph. 2:8-10 I Th. 1:9 5:8-9 I Pe. 1:5,9 Phil. 1:7 2:12-13 Heb. 9:28
  - 2. The consummation is nearer now than it ever has been. v. 11b
  - 3. The night of this present evil age is nearly over. v. 12a 8:19-22 12:2 Gal. 1:4 II Th. 1:5-8 Heb. 10:35-37
  - 4. The day of the Lord is about to dawn. 16:20 He. 9:28
- C. Do you understand the times?
  - 1. It is important to understand the times in which you live. Mt. 16:1-3 I Chr. 12:32
  - 2. Did Paul expect Jesus to return in his lifetime? 11:12ff I Th. 4:15 II Th. 1:6-7 2:1ff I Co. 7:29f Acts 1:6-7 Mk. 13:33
  - 3. We live in the last age. Acts 2:17 I Co. 10:11 He. 1:1-2 9:26 10:25 Js. 5:8 I Pe. 1:20 I Jo. 2:18 Re. 1:3 22:10
    - a. The great events anticipated by the Old Testament prophets have taken place.
    - b. The last major event is the return of Christ bringing the final consummation.
  - 4. Be patient. God doesn't view time the same way you do. II Pe. 3:3-9 Rev. 6:11
  - 5. The certainty of Jesus' return and the uncertainty of the time motivates believers throughout all generations to pursue holiness. Mark 13:33-36 Titus 2:11-14
  - 6. Bad eschatology saps motivation. II Th. 2:1-2
- D. We live in the age of the already and the not yet.
  - 1. We already have been delivered out of the world's darkness and have been brought into the light of God's kingdom. <u>Col. 1:13-14</u>
  - 2. We eagerly await the Lord's return in which His kingdom will be fully realized. Phil. 1:20-21
  - 3. Live in light of the times.

### III. Get dressed and get moving! v. 12b-14

- A. Your life should reflect the realities of your conversion. 8:29-30 <u>I Th. 5:4-6</u> Ti. 2:14 Eph. 5:8 I Jo. 3:2-3
- B. Change your clothes. v. 12b
  - 1. Lay aside the deeds of darkness. <u>Eph. 4:22</u> Co. 3:8 He. 12:1 Js. 1:21 I Pe. 2:1 Job 24:13-17 I Th. 5:7
  - 2. Put on the armor of light. <u>I Th. 5:8</u> Eph. 4:24 6:13ff II Co. 6:7 10:4f Co. 3:10
- C. Walk worthily. v. 13
  - 1. No longer engage in your old nighttime activities. <u>Gal. 5:19-21</u> I Co. 6:9-11 Titus 3:3f I Pe. 4:3-4 He. 13:4

- 2. Strife and envy are ranked with these other awful vices. 1:29 16:17f I Ti. 6:4 Titus 3:9 Js. 3:14,16 4:1ff
- 3. Instead live (walk) as those who belong to the daytime. Eph. 5:8 I Jo. 2:6,9-11 II Pe. 3:13-14
- D. Put on Christ. v. 14a
  - 1. You have already been clothed in His righteousness for your justification. 6:3-6 Gal. 3:27 Isa. 61:10 Mt. 22:12 Phil. 3:9
  - 2. Now you should reflect His character. 8:29 Col. 3:10 I Jo. 2:6 I Pe. 2:21 Ga. 5:22f Phil. 3:13-14
  - 3. How do you do this?
    - a. Remember who you are. 6:11
    - b. Live in light of who you are. 6:12f
  - 4. When the Lord returns you will be perfectly Christlike. 8:29 I Jo. 3:2-3
- E. Having put on Christ, make no provision for the lusts of the flesh. v. 14b 8:12f
  - 1. The battle for the body takes place in the heart. Js. 1:14f Ga. 5:13,16,24 I Pe. 2:11
  - 2. Plan ahead to stay far from temptation. Pr. 5:8 24:8 Ps. 36:4
  - 3. Don't make allowances for your sin. I Co. 15:33
  - 4. Be prepared to take drastic action, for the stakes are high. Mt. 5:29-30 Acts 19:19
  - 5. In some cases the application of this exhortation is individual. 14:1ff
