## How to Make Disciples Acts 16:1-15

## Main Point:

With loving winsomeness, endeavor to make disciples for Christ as you trust in the Spirit's guidance and power.

1. To make disciples for Christ, you need to be lovingly winsome.

2. To make disciples for Christ, you need the Holy Spirit to lead you to the people of His choosing.

3. To make disciples for Christ, you need the Holy Spirit to open the hearts of sinners.

4. With loving winsomeness, endeavor to make disciples for Christ as you trust in the Spirit's guidance and power.

- **1 Corinthians 9:19-22** <sup>19</sup> For though I am free from all *men*, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win the more; <sup>20</sup> and to the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might win Jews; to those *who are* under the law, as under the law, that I might win those *who are* under the law; <sup>21</sup> to those *who are* without law, as without law (not being without law toward God, but under law toward Christ), that I might win those *who are* without law; <sup>22</sup> to the weak I became as weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all *men*, that I might by all means save some. (NKJV)
- **1 Corinthians 10:32-11:1** <sup>32</sup> Give no offense, either to the Jews or to the Greeks or to the church of God, <sup>33</sup> just as I also please all *men* in all *things*, not seeking my own profit, but the *profit* of many, that they may be saved. <sup>1</sup> Imitate me, just as I also *imitate* Christ. (NKJV)
