

The 6th Word from the Cross: The Word of Victory (John 19:30)

Last two messages focused on the tragedy of the cross; now to its triumph

In His cry "I thirst": hear lamentation, now, cry of jubilation: "It Is Finished"

"It Is Finished" one word in the original: whole Gospel is wrapped up in it

No tragic, despairing cry of helplessness: it was a declaration of completion

I. Jesus Fulfilled all Prophecies Concerning Himself before He Died

"It is finished" all prophecies concerning His redemption were now finished

II. The Completion of His Suffering

His whole life was comprised of suffering (Ps 88:15) cross was the climax

Never again in the hands of Satan, never again God's presence be hidden

III. The Purpose of the Incarnation Is Accomplished

Work of redemption specifically given to the Son to accomplish (John 5:36)

IV. The Atonement Is Accomplished

Son of Man came to seek and save that which was lost (1Tim 1:15; Gal 4:5)

V. The End of our Sins

The Lord has laid on Him the iniquities of us all (Is 53:6; 1 Pet 2:24)

VI. The Fulfillment of the Law's Requirements

Rom 8:3-4; Gal 4:4-5; Matt 5:17; Gal 3:13; Rom 10:4; Rom 6:14

VII. The Destruction of Satan's Power
