Esther 9 & 10 NT: Revelation 21:1-7 July 29, 2012 Larry Yeager

Theme: Like Esther and company, we live as a people set apart, but scattered throughout the world. We must live with our hearts fixed on His promise, and we must rejoice in His saving works both in this life – and for the life to come.

Background: The "negative" assessment of Esther in the church.

Introduction: Anticipation vs. Reality

I. The Day Arrives – Adar 13, The Day of Battle

- A. Deliverance is assured reverse of Haman' plans! (1-4)
 - Officials back Mordecai and the Jews
- B. Deliverance described (5-15)
 - 1. Promise holds true
 - The "Amalekites"? Defeated
 - Promise fulfilled (Exodus 17:14,15; Genesis 12:3)
 - 2. In Susa
 - Haman's sons killed all named.
 - The line of this Agagite is ended!
 - 3. No plunder taken! Not in whole kingdom. (vv.10, 15, 16)
 - Didn't belong to them? Devoted to God??
 - In fulfillment of command to Saul? Holy War?

II. A Second Day in Susa? (vv.11-15)

- A. "What is your wish?"
 - Another day of war & Haman's sons are hung (1 Samuel 31:12)
 - The continuing moral ambiguity of Esther
- B. The dark side of God's servants
- C. One with "clean hands and a pure heart". (Psalms 24:4)

III. Let the Party Begin - Purim and the Day of Rest (vv.16-19)

- A. On two days?
 - Adar 14 for those in the country
 - Adar 15 for those in the city. Traditionally Jerusalem, Hebron and Jericho.
- B. Different from other feasts (vv.20, 26-27, 29)
 - 1. Not prescribed by Moses/Torah
 - 2. Not celebrated on the day of the battle
 - a. Story of deliverance
 - b. Looks forward to the joy of the resurrection of Christ
 - c. On the day of rest from the battle!!
 - 3. A type of the Sabbath (Revelation 1:17-18; 21:5)

IV. Living in the Diaspora

Book of Esther is written uniquely for the people of the Diaspora.

- A. Jews living outside of the Holy Land.
 - The last 1900 years of their existence.
 - 1. Purim is celebrated throughout the ages
 - Focused on the Providence of God
 - 2. Tested, but not forgotten, in the Holocaust
- B. Christians in the Diaspora
 - 1. Living in an age when God seems quiet.
 - 2. His hand of Providence still evident!
 - Preserving the universe and all life within it. (Heb. 1:3; Col. 1:7)
 - His concurrance in every human action! (Acts 4:27,28)
 - Moving all of history toward a planned end. (Genesis 45:5-8)
 - 3. Faithful to His promise and covenant
- C. Waiting for our day of rest?
 - 1. This world remains dangerous place for God's people
 - Our own hearts betray us sinful, prideful, fearful
 - The hatred of the world who hated Him first.

Therefore: we preach of a God who saves *sinful* people.

- 2. Waiting for that day of eternal rest!
- V. The Last Word chapter 10
 - A. Life goes on!
 - 1. But Christ has attained the victory!
 - We wait, and fight, and watch for His coming.
 - 2. True climax is yet to come! Revelation 21, 22
 - Celebrate *NOW* because is it certain!
 - B. Toss out Esther? Never. A book for the church today.
 - the promise is given
 - the assurance made
 - the fight we must continue
 - the deliverance that awaits
