TITLE Hebrew: In the beginning

Greek (LXX): Geneseis = birth; lineage; (origins), genao = to be born, give birth

Latin Vulgate: Genesis

Genesis is the first of the 5 books of the Pentateuch, the first 5 books of the Hebrew Bible, attributed to

Moses. Pentateuch originates from the late Greek "penta" = 5 + "teuchos" = tool, vessel, book.

II. Author & Date

A. The book of Genesis does not name its author, though the Pentateuch itself shows Moses involved in the authoring of the first 5 books of the Old Testament.

Exodus 24:3-7 Then Moses came and recounted to the people all the words of the LORD and all the ordinances; and all the people answered with one voice and said, "All the words which the LORD has spoken we will do!" Moses wrote down all the words of the LORD. Then he arose early in the morning, and built an altar at the foot of the mountain with twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. He sent young men of the sons of Israel, and they offered burnt offerings and sacrificed young bulls as peace offerings to the LORD. Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and the other half of the blood he sprinkled on the altar. Then he took the book of the covenant and read it in the hearing of the people; and they said, "All that the LORD has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient!"

Deuteronomy 31:24 It came about, when Moses finished writing the words of this law in a book until they were complete, 25 that Moses commanded the Levites who carried the ark of the covenant of the LORD, saying, 26 "Take this book of the law and place it beside the ark of the covenant of the LORD your God, that it may remain there as a witness against you.

B. The New Testament indicates that the author of the Pentateuch, including Genesis, was Moses, with "the book of Moses" referring to the entire Pentateuch.

Mark 12:26 "But regarding the fact that the dead rise again, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the passage about the burning bush, how God spoke to him, saying, 'I AM THE GOD OF ABRAHAM, AND THE GOD OF ISAAC, and the God of Jacob '?

Luke 20:28 and they questioned Him, saying, "Teacher, <u>Moses wrote for us</u> that IF A MAN'S BROTHER DIES, having a wife, AND HE IS CHILDLESS, HIS BROTHER SHOULD MARRY THE WIFE AND RAISE UP CHILDREN TO HIS BROTHER (Deut 25:5).

Luke 24:27 NAU) Then <u>beginning with Moses</u> and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures ... 44 Now He said to them, "These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are <u>written about Me in the Law of Moses</u> and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled."

John 1:45 Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found Him of whom Moses in the Law and also the Prophets wrote-- Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."

John 5:46 "For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me, for he wrote about Me.

Romans 10:5 For <u>Moses writes</u> that the man who practices the righteousness which is based on law shall live by that righteousness (Lev 18:5).

- 2 Corinthians 3:15 But to this day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their heart;
- C. Critical scholars such as Julius Wellhausen and his disciples have denied Mosaic authorship, suggesting multiple later authors (JEDP), and as late as 1893 espousing the view that writing was not employed until around the time of David, so that Moses couldn't have written the Pentateuch, even if he had wanted to.
 - 1. I say this to encourage us to be patient in the face of claims that deny what the Scriptures obviously state, not shaken in your faith in the Word of God and the God of the Word. In 1901 an archaeological expedition found a 7.4 foot stele with the law code of the Babylonian king, Hammurabi inscribed on it, dating back to 1754 BC, over 200 years before the birth of Moses. (show slide) Conservative scholars date Israel's exodus from Egypt around 1446 BC when Moses was 80 years old (he lived to 120, Deut. 34:7).
 - 2. Believers a hundred years before the code of Hammurabi was discovered still needed to accept by faith the Word of God's witness to Mosaic authorship, even without objective proof that writing was employed during his life. Today we no doubt must also believe without having objective proof to answer all denials of what God's Word is saying. Perhaps some objective answers will be discovered later to silence the critics, but in the meantime we must patiently wait for the Lord, not argue with supposed objective evidence that is fabricated, baseless, sloppily deduced.
 - Hebrews 11:3 By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things which are visible.
- D. Mosaic authorship does not preclude/rule out editing work done by Moses or his successors (E.g., Joshua).
 - 1. The material of Genesis all takes place before the birth of Moses. He might have been led by God's Spirit to include information from genealogies and records handed down from earlier authors and compilers perhaps Noah, Abraham, Joseph, etc. The Spirit moves on the biblical authors to both reveal truth and to select/edit truth.
 - Joshua 10:13 So the sun stood still, and the moon stopped, until the nation avenged themselves of their enemies. **Is it not written in the book of Jashar?** And the sun stopped in the middle of the sky and did not hasten to go *down* for about a whole day.
 - 1 Kings 11:41 Now the rest of the acts of Solomon and whatever he did, and his wisdom, are they not written in the **book of the acts of Solomon**?
 - 2 Chronicles 9:29 Now the rest of the acts of Solomon, from first to last, are they not written in the records of Nathan the prophet, and in the prophecy of Ahijah the Shilonite, and in the visions of Iddo the seer concerning Jeroboam the son of Nebat?
 - Proverbs 25:1 These also are proverbs of Solomon which the men of Hezekiah, king of Judah, transcribed.
 - 2. There is evidence of some editing of Moses's work (by Joshua?) within the Pentateuch.
 - a. E.g., Deuteronomy 34 which describes the death and burial of Moses.
 - Deuteronomy 34:1 Now Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho. And the LORD showed him all the land ... ⁸ So the sons of Israel wept for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days; then the days of weeping and mourning for Moses came to an end. ⁹ Now Joshua the son of Nun was filled with the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands on him; and the sons of Israel listened to him and did as the LORD had commanded Moses. ¹⁰ Since that time no prophet has risen in Israel like Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face,

b. E.g., Genesis 14:14, where Abram pursued "as far as Dan" four invading kings who took Lot hostage. Since the tribe of Dan did not receive its inheritance of land by lot until after the death of Moses (Joshua 19:40-48), this would be unintelligible to Moses's readers, even if Moses received by revelation advanced information of Dan's inheritance while writing Genesis (which is nowhere suggested - he was shown Dan's inheritance just before his death on Mt. Nebo, Deut. 34:1).

Genesis 14:14 When <u>Abram</u> heard that his relative had been taken captive, he led out his trained men, born in his house, three hundred and eighteen, and **went in pursuit as far as Dan**.

Joshua 19:40 The seventh lot fell to the tribe of the sons of Dan according to their families. ... The territory of the sons of Dan proceeded beyond them; for the sons of Dan went up and fought with Leshem and captured it. Then they struck it with the edge of the sword and possessed it and settled in it; and they called Leshem Dan after the name of Dan their father.

III. Recipients of Genesis

Depending on when during the 40 years in the wilderness Moses wrote Genesis, it could have been beneficial for the wilderness generation as Exodus and Leviticus certainly were, but would with the rest of the Pentateuch have been delivered in its final form to their children and children's children.

IV. Purpose of Genesis

A. With the children and grandchildren of the wilderness generation taking possession of the land of promise, it would have been tempting to forget the Lord and to adopt the gods and practices of the surrounding nations, or of Egypt from which they had departed. Genesis encourages God's people to worship, fear, trust in Him alone as the only true God, Who is the source of every blessing and all that is truly good. I.e., don't turn to Baal to bless your crops and herds with fertility - rather call upon the Lord.

Acts 7:39 "Our fathers were unwilling to be obedient to him, but repudiated him and in their hearts turned back to Egypt, 40 SAYING TO AARON, 'MAKE FOR US GODS WHO WILL GO BEFORE US; FOR THIS MOSES WHO LED US OUT OF THE LAND OF EGYPT-- WE DO NOT KNOW WHAT HAPPENED TO HIM.' 41 "At that time they made a calf and brought a sacrifice to the idol, and were rejoicing in the works of their hands.

Deuteronomy 8:10 "When you have eaten and are satisfied, you shall bless the LORD your God for the good land which He has given you. 11 "Beware that you do not forget the LORD your God by not keeping His commandments and His ordinances and His statutes which I am commanding you today;

1. Notice the points of contact between the creation account of Genesis 1 & 2 and Moses' words to the children of the wilderness generation as they were about to take possession of their inheritance across the Jordan. They were to understand that they were being given in measure an imperfect yet good "redo" of what Adam and Eve faced in the garden, the temptation coming from the surrounding nations under the power of the old serpent, the devil.

Genesis 1:28 God blessed them; and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it; and rule over the fish of the sea and the birds of the sky and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Deuteronomy 8:1 "All the commandments that I am commanding you today you shall be careful to do, that you may live and multiply, and go in and possess the land which the LORD swore to give to your forefathers.

Genesis 1:12 The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed after their kind, and trees bearing fruit with seed in them, after their kind; and <u>God saw that it was good</u>. 29 Then God said, "Behold, <u>I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the surface of all the earth, and every tree which has fruit yielding seed; it shall be food for you;</u>

Deuteronomy 8:7 "For the LORD your God is bringing you into <u>a good land</u>, a land of brooks of water, of fountains and springs, flowing forth in valleys and hills; ⁸ <u>a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive oil and honey; ⁹ a land where you will eat food without scarcity</u>

Genesis 2:17 but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die."

Deuteronomy 8:19 "It shall come about if you ever forget the LORD your God and go after other gods and serve them and worship them, I testify against you today that **you will surely perish**.

2. The creation account in Genesis 1 & 2 is intended to instill faith in God alone. Notice it does not specify everything God created - E.g., the angels. So why did God include the particular elements in this significant yet select list of what He did create? Fallen humanity, whether the Egyptians or Canaanites, worshiped the visible creation. God is reminding His people that He created all the things the peoples vainly worship, so that Israel will worship Yahweh alone. The plagues by which God brought Egypt to its knees and brought out the Israelites to be His chosen people were attacks on gods of the Egyptians, who worship the Nile, cattle, frogs, sun, Pharaoh and his first born descendants, etc. The Canaanites worship Prince Yam, the sea god, and Baal, the god of the storm and fertility.

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Romans 1:22 Professing to be wise, they became fools, ²³ and exchanged the glory of the incorruptible God for an image in the form of corruptible man and of birds and four-footed animals and crawling creatures. ²⁴ Therefore God gave them over in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, so that their bodies would be dishonored among them. ²⁵ For they exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen.

- B. Prominent themes in Genesis that further this purpose include ...
 - 1. Blessing. A prominent theme in Genesis is "blessing" (Hebrew: barak), along with the antithetical/contrasting theme of "curse."
 - Genesis 5:2 He created them male and female, and <u>He blessed them</u> and named them man in the day when they were created.
 - Genesis 9:1 And God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth.
 - Genesis 12:1 Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go forth from your country, and from your relatives and from your father's house, to the land which I will show you; ² And I will make you a great nation, and <u>I will bless you</u>, and make your name great; and so <u>you shall be a blessing</u>; ³ And <u>I will bless those who bless you</u>, and the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed."
 - Genesis 22:18 "In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice."
 - Genesis 26:3 Sojourn in this land and I will be with you and bless you, for to you and to your descendants I will give all these lands, and I will establish the oath which I swore to your father Abraham. I will multiply your descendants as the stars of heaven, and will give your descendants all these lands; and by-your descendants all the nations of the earth shall-be-blessed;

Genesis 28:13 And behold, the LORD stood above it and said, "I am the LORD, the God of your father Abraham and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie, I will give it to you and to your descendants. 14 "Your descendants will also be like the dust of the earth, and you will spread out to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and in your descendants shall all the families of the earth be blessed.

Genesis 49:28 All these are the twelve tribes of Israel, and this is what their father said to them when <u>he blessed them.</u>

He blessed them, every one with the blessing appropriate to him.

Galatians 3:13 Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us-- for it is written, "CURSED IS EVERYONE WHO HANGS ON A TREE "-- 14 in order that in Christ Jesus the blessing of Abraham might come to the Gentiles, so that we would receive the promise of the Spirit through faith. ... 16 Now the promises were spoken to Abraham and to his seed. He does not say, "And to seeds," as referring to many, but rather to one, "And to your seed," that is, Christ.

Galatians 3:29 And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's seed (sperma), heirs according to promise.

a. We see in the creation account that God is the source of all blessing, that His desire is to be a blessing and bring blessing to His creation, demonstrated in that He created it "good." Related to blessing are the themes of good and evil. What is good is a blessing, what is evil is not, but results in curse.

Genesis 1:22 <u>God blessed them</u>, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth."

Genesis 1:28 **God blessed them**; and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it; and rule over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Genesis 1:31 God saw all that He had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

b. God is a blessing, because He is good. The creation account reveals not only God's wisdom and power, but also His divine nature as being "good," and therefore, a blessing for all who call upon Him. When we by faith in Him conform to what He created us to be and what is good, we enjoy His blessing.

Psalm 119:68 You are good and do good; Teach me Your statutes.

Psalm 86:5 For You, Lord, are good, and ready to forgive, and abundant in lovingkindness to all who call upon You.

Psalm 145:9 The LORD is good to all, and His mercies are over all His works.

2. A dominant theme of Genesis and throughout the Pentateuch is: "I will be with you," encouraging us to put our faith in the Lord. If God is with us, He will bless us (Gen. 26:3).

Genesis 21:22 Now it came about at that time that Abimelech and Phicol, the commander of his army, spoke to Abraham, saying, **"God is with you** in all that you do;

Genesis 26:3 "Sojourn in this land and <u>I will be with you and bless you</u>, for to you and to your descendants I will give all these lands, and I will establish the oath which I swore to your father Abraham.

Genesis 24:40 "He said to me, 'The LORD, before whom I have walked, will send His angel with you to make your journey successful, and you will take a wife for my son from my relatives and from my father's house;

Genesis 31:3 Then the LORD said to Jacob, "Return to the land of your fathers and to your relatives, and <u>I will be with you</u>."

Genesis 48:21 Then Israel said to Joseph, "Behold, I am about to die, but **God will be with you**, and bring you back to the land of your fathers.

Genesis 50:24 Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die, but **God will surely take care of you** and bring you up from this land to the land which He promised on oath to Abraham, to Isaac and to Jacob."

Matthew 28:20 teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, <u>I am with you always</u>, even to the end of the age."

3. Covenant. God is a faithful, covenant keeping God who establishes His covenant in order to bring about blessing upon His creation. God's covenant with Abraham in Genesis provides the basis for the exodus from Egypt and for Exodus as a book of the covenant.

Genesis 6:18 "But I will establish My covenant with you; and you shall enter the ark-- you and your sons and your wife, and your sons' wives with you.

Genesis 9:9 "Now behold, I Myself do establish My covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; ¹⁰ and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the cattle, and every beast of the earth with you; of all that comes out of the ark, even every beast of the earth. ¹¹ "I establish My covenant with you; and all flesh shall never again be cut off by the water of the flood, neither shall there again be a flood to destroy the earth."

Genesis 15:18 On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, "To your descendants I have given this land, from the river of Egypt as far as the great river, the river Euphrates:

Genesis 17:4 "As for Me, behold, <u>My covenant is with you</u>, and you will be the father of a multitude of nations. ... ⁷ "I will establish My covenant between Me and you and your descendants after you throughout their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your descendants after you.

Exodus 2:24 So God heard their groaning; and <u>God remembered His covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob</u>. ²⁵ God saw the sons of Israel, and God took notice of them.

Exodus 24:7 Then he took **the book of the covenant** and read *it* in the hearing of the people; and they said, "All that the LORD has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient!"

- 4. Justification by faith in the Lord. Faith which finds saving favor with God is explicitly stated in several ways (E.g., believe/faith, call on the name of the Lord, walking with God) or implicitly demonstrated by obedience. Wisdom begins to emerge by faith in the Lord, a wisdom that Adam & Eve mistakenly sought through disobedience. Wisdom cannot be developed by doing evil, for evil undermines and destroys God's good creation and its intended blessing. The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.
 - a. Explicitly

Genesis 4:26 To Seth, to him also a son was born; and he called his name Enosh. <u>Then men began to call upon the name of the LORD</u>.

Romans 10:13 for "WHOEVER WILL CALL ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE SAVED."

1 Corinthians 1:2 To the church of God which is at Corinth, to those who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, saints by calling, with all who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, their Lord and ours:

Genesis 5:21 Enoch lived sixty-five years, and became the father of Methuselah. ²² Then <u>Enoch walked with</u> <u>God</u> three hundred years after he became the father of Methuselah, and he had *other* sons and daughters. ²³ So all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty-five years. ²⁴ <u>Enoch walked with God</u>; and he was not, for God took him.

Hebrews 11:5 By faith Enoch was taken up so that he would not see death; AND HE WAS NOT FOUND BECAUSE GOD TOOK HIM UP; for he obtained the witness that before his being taken up he was pleasing to God.

Genesis 15:6 Then he believed in the LORD; and He reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Romans 4:9 Is this blessing then on the circumcised, or on the uncircumcised also? For we say, "FAITH WAS CREDITED TO ABRAHAM AS RIGHTEOUSNESS." ¹⁰ How then was it credited? While he was circumcised, or uncircumcised? Not while circumcised, but while uncircumcised; ¹¹ and he received the sign of circumcision, a seal of the righteousness of the faith which he had while uncircumcised, so that he might be the father of all who believe without being circumcised, that righteousness might be credited to them, ¹² and the father of circumcision to those who not only are of the circumcision, but who also follow in the steps of the faith of our father Abraham which he had while uncircumcised.

Genesis 6:13 Then God said to Noah, "The end of all flesh has come before Me; for the earth is filled with violence because of them; and behold, I am about to destroy them with the earth. ¹⁴ "Make for yourself an ark of gopher wood; you shall make the ark with rooms, and shall cover it inside and out with pitch. ... ²² <u>Thus Noah</u> did; according to all that God had commanded him, so he did.

Hebrews 11:7 <u>By faith Noah</u>, being warned *by God* about things not yet seen, <u>in reverence prepared</u> <u>an ark for the salvation of his household</u>, <u>by which he condemned the world</u>, <u>and became an heir of the righteousness which is according to faith</u>.

Genesis 12:1 Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go forth from your country, and from your relatives and from your father's house, to the land which I will show you;... ⁴ So Abram went forth as the LORD had spoken to him; and Lot went with him. Now Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran.

Hebrews 11:8 **By faith Abraham**, when he was called, **obeyed** by going out to a place which he was to receive for an inheritance; and he went out, not knowing where he was going.

Genesis 22:16 and said, "By Myself I have sworn, declares the LORD, because you have done this thing and have not withheld your son, your only son, 17 indeed I will greatly bless you, and I will greatly multiply your seed as the stars of the heavens and as the sand which is on the seashore; and your seed shall possess the gate of their enemies. 18 "In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice."

Hebrews 11:17 By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was offering up his only begotten son;

Hebrews 11:13 All these died in faith, without receiving the promises, but having seen them and having welcomed them from a distance, and having confessed that they were strangers and exiles on the earth.

- C. These themes portray how and why God set about to establish his plan of blessing through the seed of Abraham.
 - 1. At each stage of redemptive history, as evil threatened to jeopardize the blessing, the Lord either prevented it (Gen 20:6) or overcame it with good (Gen 50:20), because His purpose to bring blessing and good to His people and His creation will not be thwarted, but will depend on His righteousness, wisdom, and power.
 - 2. Genesis 1-11 explains the reason for setting apart a special people to worship God. Two opposite progressions take place in these chapters. First, there is the orderly creation of God, climaxing in the blessing of humanity. Second, there is the disintegrating work of sin, bringing the curses of pain, death, judgment (flood), and dispersion/division. The first progression demonstrates God's intent to bring about a perfect order of blessing. The second progression demonstrates the great need of God's intervention in the human race to provide a solution to human corruption, ruination, destruction. As the human race multiplied and advanced, it became corrupted beyond repair and was destroyed by God through a flood. After this judgment, however, the new humanity exhibited the old nature. The narrative that proceeds the emergence of Abraham leaves the reader looking for a solution, which comes through the election and plan/promise of blessing through Abraham and his seed, whose development and blessing is the subject of chapters 12 50, which end in a way that provides a basis for the Exodus, and reminds us of what we see at the beginning, that God's intention is to bring blessing to His creation, even taking what we intend for evil, and making it into something good.

Genesis 50:20 "As for you, you meant evil against me, but <u>God meant it for good</u> in order to bring about this present result, to preserve many people alive. (Romans 8:28 And we know that <u>God causes all things to work together for good</u> to those who love God, to those who are called according to *His* purpose.)

Genesis 50:24 Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die, but God will surely take care of you and bring you up from this land to the land which He promised on oath to Abraham, to Isaac and to Jacob." ²⁵ Then Joseph made the sons of Israel swear, saying, "God will surely take care of you, and you shall carry my bones up from here." ²⁶ So Joseph died at the age of one hundred and ten years; and he was embalmed and placed in a coffin in Egypt.
