## Running Away from God Jonah 1:1-3

## Main Point:

Instead of running away from God, trust that He knows best and hold fast to His Word.

1. God makes His will known to you in the Bible.

- 2. But you struggle to obey God's will because you often disagree with Him.
- 3. Whenever you allow your opinion to prevail, you're effectively running away from God.
- 4. Running away from God is both a costly and foolish thing to do.
- 5. Instead, you should trust that God knows best and hold fast to His Word.
