Leviticus 18:24-25

²⁴ "Do not make yourselves unclean by any of these things, for by all these the nations I am driving out before you have become unclean, 25 and the land became unclean, so that I punished its iniquity, and the land vomited out its inhabitants.

Leviticus 18:4-5

⁴ You shall follow my rules and keep my statutes and walk in them. *I am the Lord your God*. ⁵ You shall therefore keep my statutes and my rules; if a person does them, he shall live by them: I am the Lord.

Romans 7:10-14

The very commandment that promised life proved to be death to me. 11 For sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through So the law is holy, and the it killed me. commandment is holy and righteous and good.

Did that which is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, producing death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become

sinful beyond measure. ¹⁴ For we know that *the law is spiritual*, but I am of the flesh, sold under sin.

Key Idea

God's authority in the bedroom helps us to see how much we despise God's authority.

Leviticus 18:6-7

⁶ "None of you shall *approach* any one of his **close relatives** *to uncover nakedness*³. I am the Lord. You shall not uncover the nakedness of your father, which is the nakedness of your mother; she is your mother, you shall not uncover her nakedness. ...

³ While the idiom certainly means sexual relations, the use of the verb suggests a more forceful or passionate activity (A. Noordtzij, *Leviticus* [trans. R. Trogtman; Bible Student's Commentary; Grand Rapids: Zondervan, 1982], 183) and implies that the perpetrator is forcefully taking advantage of someone who is vulnerable, someone living with him who may be a dependent.³

¹⁸ And you shall not take a woman as *a rival wife* to her sister, *uncovering her nakedness* while her sister is still alive. (Jacob?)

¹⁹ "You shall not approach a woman *to uncover her nakedness* while she is **in her menstrual uncleanness**. (v. 29 - Cut Off)

²⁰ And you shall not <u>lie sexually with your neighbor's</u>

wife and so make yourself unclean with her.

You shall not give any of your children to offer them to Molech, and so profane the name of your God: I am the Lord.

²² You shall not lie with a male as with a woman; it is an *abomination*. (Offensive)

And you shall not <u>lie with any animal</u> and so make yourself unclean with it, neither shall <u>any woman give</u> <u>herself to an animal to lie with it</u>: it is **perversion**. (Offensive Confusion)

A. We Despise Authority!

2 Peter 2:9-10a

[Noah, Lot...] ⁹ then the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from trials, and to keep the unrighteous under punishment until the day of judgment, ¹⁰ and especially those who indulge in <u>the lust of defiling passion</u> and <u>despise authority</u>. ...

B. Transformed by a True Husband

Ephesians 5:25–33

25 Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, 26 that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, 27 so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. 28 In the same way husbands should love

their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, ³⁰ because we are members of his body. ³¹ "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." ³² This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church.

However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

Key Idea

Our lives, our bodies, our marriages were created by God to declare the marriage between Christ & the Church. We do not belong to ourselves. We belong to our Husband and He has given himself for us!
