- C. David was the one anointed by God to be king instead of Saul
- D. David had the sure promise of the Word of God as the basis for faith and action
- E. David was responsible for the safety and well-being (physically and spiritually) of his men and their families, and indeed the entire nation
- F. David had the right of self-defense as a man who was righteous defending himself against Saul's criminal intent to deprive of him of life and liberty.
