		This story about Peter provides us a of the process by which God renews our minds—7 steps:
		Step 1: God confronts us with a we never understood before—thru the Word, prayer, a sermon
		Step 2: Often we react strongly against this truth (like Peter) & say, "so, Lord!" & refuse to hear
		Step 3: God His communication of the truth as often as needed, thru different channels
		Step 4: We wonder what this truth means and how it applies to us; the Bible calls this
		Step 5: We may connect this new truth with other truths that God has taught us in the past: 2 + 2 =
		Step 6: God often immediately puts us in a circumstance in which we mustthe truth we learned
		Step 7: Not only do we change and practice the new truth, we the new truth to others.
