"Believing the Impossible"

Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ as we tackle the **second** in a three-part series juxtaposing **PHYSICS** and **FAITH**. The **FIRST** Sunday we learned from **Heisenberg's "Principle of Uncertainty**" that in spite of the absolute certainty of **GOD'S promises to us**, God's people still need to be prepared to "*expect the unexpected*" while we walk this earth...but never let that stop us from boldly ploughing forward. **This** morning, we'll also use quantum **physics** to reinforce our **FAITH** in the process of "*Believing the Impossible*."

Back in 1964, one of the most revolutionary discoveries in the world of quantum physics was made by James Stuart Bell, an Irish physicist who essentially disproved the previously believed "principle of local causes" and postulated that everything in the universe is interconnected and UNLIMITED...even the perceived barrier of the speed of light! Thus, two particles that have separated will continue to interact and influence each other—instantaneously—regardless of the time and space between them. SHAZAM!

Let me try to explain those "**possibilities**". As we communicate by **talking**, voices produce **sound** waves carrying information at about 700 miles per hour. So, the length of time it takes you to hear me "**wax eloquent**" from the **pulpit** depends on the distance **between** us, with those in the **front** row hearing me infinitesimally faster than those in the back rows (where **most** Lutherans prefer to **sit**.) But the **fastest** communication signals are **light** waves that carry information at approximately **186,000 miles per second**! Almost all of classical **PHYSICS** rests on the assumption that nothing in the universe can travel faster than **the speed of LIGHT**, once considered by physicists to be kind of "the universal **speed limit sign**" posted on **the road to anywhere** in the universe...until **NOW**.

Recent experiments have shown that if two subatomic particles shoot into space as the result of a subatomic **reaction**—then unlike what happens in **Vegas**, what happens to **one** particle **IS** communicated or **SHARED** with the **other** particle "**superluminally**", meaning even **faster** than the speed of light! This seemingly **impossible "instantaneous nonlocality**" is an invisible link between **all** particles that defies both **space AND time**. "Bell's Theorem" uncovered that what once was thought to be IMPOSSIBLE actually IS possible...all because we live in a nonlocal universe with instantaneous, superluminal connections...and we Christians might add...supernatural ones! (But then, you "prayer warriors" among us knew that all along!) NOTHING is impossible to those who have FAITH in God's power and promises!

A week ago, I spoke about Heisenberg's "Uncertainty Principle" that said nothing is absolutely CERTAIN. There is always a range of uncertainty in the world of quantum mechanics, so we believers need to be prepared to EXPECT the UNEXPECTED to happen! Bell's Theorem is kind of a corollary adding, "There is always a range of possibility."

But again, why should that surprise US? After ALL, didn't Jesus Himself redefine what IS and what is NOT possible! In Mark 9, the father of a demonafflicted boy asks Jesus to heal his son...but with a qualifier: "IF You can". "What do you mean, 'If I can'?" Jesus responds. "Anything is possible if a person **BELIEVES**!" When asked in Matt. 19 about how a person can be deemed truly responds, "With man this is impossible, "righteous". Jesus but with God ALL things are possible." In fact, we can say Jesus positively trafficked in making the **IMPOSSIBLY POSSIBLE**! He interrupted weather patterns on the Sea of Galilee. He changed the molecular structure of water into wine...really GOOD wine! He hardwired a blind man's brain, installing synapses between the optical nerve and visual cortex without surgery! Jesus walked ON water and THROUGH walls! He turned energy into MATTER, made the deaf hear, the mute talk, and the lame walk. He raised people from the dead and then He Himself rose from the grave on Easter morning to prove the Father had accepted HIS sacrifice for OUR sins. That's a pretty impressive resume of miracles... things many skeptical physicists had written off as being...well... just as **impossible** as exceeding the speed of **light**!

And so, you may respond, "Yes, easy to SAY, but that's JESUS! Not ME!" Then what about John 14:12 where Jesus says, "I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in Me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these." And so, "miracles" basically represent in Scripture a <u>reaffirmation</u> of divine FAITH and <u>redefinition</u> of what's POSSIBLE in this world when God acts in the life of His people. Jesus said, "Everything is possible to Him who believes."

In the **SPIRITUAL** realm, **FAITH** is the only difference between what is **impossible** and what is **possible**. Impossibilities **disappear** as we **develop** our faith—not in **ourselves**, of course—but in our **ALMIGHTY God** and His **PROMISES**. Emily **Dickinson** once said, *"I DWELL in possibility."* Every follower of **Christ** ought **also** to "dwell in possibility". From the day of our **baptism**, when the Holy Spirit began to **dwell** within **US**, it became our **birthright** as believers to boldly claim with St.

Paul in Philippians 4:13 that, "I can do **all things** through Christ Who strengthens me."

From a human perspective, we tend to deal in terms of "degrees of difficulty". We have small problems and big problems...and even rather small miracles (like occasionally hearing a SHORT sermon instead of a long one) and then big miracles like the tornado skipping YOUR house while it takes out the rest of the neighborhood. However, from an omnipotent God's perspective, there are no "degrees of difficulty"! The Lord asks a question in Jer. 32:27, "Is anything too hard for Me?" That's rhetorical, folks! The answer is the Hebrew word for "Duh!"

Pastor Matt recently preached a whole **series** of messages about **Powerful Pentecost PRAYERS**. **Daniel** prayed and **hungry lions** kept their **mouths** shut! **Hezekiah** prayed and God's Angel of **Death** polished off **185,000** enemy soldiers in just one night! We tend to think of prayer requests as having "**degrees of difficulty**" and sometimes foolishly **"dumb down"** our celestially-bound petitions **accordingly**...but to an **all-powerful God**??? **Really**? See the **problem** with that? To the **INFINITE**, all **finites** are equal. There's no big or small, easy or difficult, possible or impossible comparisons or **LIMITS** to our omnipotent, Lord God <u>ALL</u>-MIGHTY!

Today's Old Testament Lesson from 2 Kings 6:1-7 records one of those seemingly impossible miracles: Elisha's popular "School of the Prophets" Training Center" was bursting at the seams, so his group of would be prophets came to Elisha and told him, "This place where we meet with you is too small. Let's go down to the Jordan River where there'll be plenty of logs and build a new place for us to meet." When they arrived at the Jordan, they began cutting down trees. But as one of them was chopping, his ax head fell into the river! He said, "Alas, master! It was borrowed!" Note the PAST tense. To him, that axe head was as good as gone with no expectation whatsoever for retrieval! He wasn't expecting a miracle, because even back THEN, the physics of metallurgy dictated that any mineral with a density greater than one gram per cubic centimeter does not float, and the density of cast iron is approximately 7.2 grams per cubic centimeter. SO...iron axe heads just don't FLOAT!

Now if I'd been **Elisha**, I'd feel bad for my student prophet who lost the borrowed axe head and maybe loan him **mine**...or at least help him get a **new** one. And yet, it probably wouldn't even cross my **mind** to pray that the original one would simply **float**! But you can tell the wheels are turning in Elisha's brain, because he asks, *"Where did it fall?"* Now what **difference** does it make? It's at the bottom of the **river**! But that doesn't stop miracle-minded **Elisha**! So, when he showed him the **place**, Elisha cut a **stick**, threw it into the water where the axe head had hit the water, and the axe head **floated** to the surface. "*Grab it*!" Elisha said to him. And

the young man reached out and **grabbed** it! The apprentice was probably was so surprised to see what he was **seeing** that he **had** to have been just standing there in **shock**!

Miracles can't be **taught** or **planned**. They can only be **experienced** and **believed**. The **irony** is these **apprentice prophets** were building a bigger school so **more** prophets could take classes from **Elisha** who, of course, had been the great prophet **Elijah's** apprentice whom God had taken alive to heaven in a whirlwind and chariot of fire! And while they're building a place to **learn**, God gives them a "**hands-on demo**" of something that can't be learned in a classroom **course book** on miracles! Even in the **New** Testament, Jesus' circle of disciples discovered that the greatest lessons are rarely learned in a **classroom** but out in the **field**, because they can't be **taught** as much as **caught** or **experienced**.

Admittedly, this miracle doesn't exactly come out of a life-and-death situation! Some of you may not even have remembered this miracle recorded in Scripture! Hey, the guy lost a borrowed AXE head! If that's the worst thing that's ever happens to you, you've led a pretty blessed life! It's an axe head! And doesn't it seem like maybe Elisha might have saved a miracle for a little bigger tragedy? I'd put this in the category of Jesus' first recorded miracle of turning water into wine at a wedding reception. Why "waste" your first miracle on helping a bride and groom save face just because they didn't have enough sense to stock enough wine for the reception? And yet, it does say something about our God...that He also cares about "the little things" in the lives of His children. Nothing is "too small" for our "great God"! John Newton, the former slave-trader turned hymnwriter, who wrote "Amazing Grace", once penned these words: "Not one concern of ours is small...If we belong to Him...To teach us this, the Lord of all...Once made some iron to swim."

Way back in 1952, J. B. Phillips, the famous Bible translator, wrote the book, <u>Your God Is Too Small</u>! Most of us believers, as well as God's churches, live way below the level of our God-given potential, because we're thinking, living, and dreaming SMALL...while shrinking God down to fit into our tiny little boxes! Our attempts at reaching out to others with the Gospel remain relatively tiny and tenuous, shaped by the restricted parameters of our OWN tiny box rather than the powerful promises of our bold and Almighty Miracle Maker. So also, many a trained physicist refused to think "outside the box", arrogantly dismissing the possibility of exceeding the speed of light, because it threatened their more comfortable limits! But remember Jesus' answer to His disciples' question about the incident in Matt. 17:20? "Jesus responded to them, "You could not drive out the demon" 'because of your little faith. For truly, I say to you, if you have faith like a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, Move from here to there,' and it will move, and nothing will be impossible for you." In the 1930's, a graduate student at UC Berkeley named George Danzig was **late to class** one day. His math prof had written **two problems** on the blackboard. Danzig assumed they were the **homework** assignment...in **fact**, the most **difficult** homework assignment he'd ever **encountered**! It took him nearly a **week** to finally figure them out, but he thought he'd still get a **bad grade** because it took so long to turn it **in**!

A few weeks later, George heard a **pounding** on his door early in the morning. He was surprised to see his **math prof** standing there. "George! You solved the problem!" George said, "Of course! They were our homework assignment." The professor said, "They weren't your homework assignment. Those were two of the most famous unsolvable problems in mathematics! The world's leading mathematicians have been trying for years to solve the two problems you solved in a just few days!" Danzig later became a professor at Stanford University. He said, "If someone had told me that they were two famous unsolved problems, I probably wouldn't even have tried to solve them!"

Danzig solved two unsolvable problems because he didn't know it "couldn't" be done. Elisha prayed for the axe head to float because his faith told him it COULD be done. You do realize, don't you, that God doesn't answer prayers we never actually get around to praying, don't you? Jesus said, "You have not because you ask not." Isn't it time we boldly offer up those prayers to see, "What FLOATS?" Isn't it time we allow GOD, rather than the physicists, to determine for us what's truly possible or impossible?

Too often, we parse and **dissect** Scripture instead of allowing Scripture to dissect **US!** Even in **Bible study**, we mistakenly think the purpose is to give us **knowledge**. That's certainly a needed **byproduct**, but St. Paul reminded his protégé, Timothy, in 2 Tim. 3:15 that the sacred writings are able to make you *"wise for salvation through FAITH in Christ Jesus"*. In other words, the **ultimate** purpose of Scripture is to give us saving **FAITH** in **God's promises** that allow us to lift our eyes toward **HEAVEN** and "**believe the impossible**"...to have **faith** in a God Who made this universe just by **speaking it** into existence!

Ever hear of the brilliant German Lutheran mathematician and astronomer, Johannes Kepler? He had the best definition of science **EVER**! He called it, *"Thinking God's thoughts after Him"*. But before Galileo provided him with a **telescope**, Kepler had scanned the stars with his naked eyes and confidently **declared** that he'd catalogued **all the stars God had put in the sky.**..all 777 of them!

I had a friend and classmate in high school who was part of the Astronomy Club. He eventually matriculated on to a **doctorate** in astrophysics and to run a planetarium in Southern California for many years. When Bob would point out things in the **sky** at night with his **homemade telescope**, he always could see far more than I could, because my "astral acumen" was woefully limited compared to his! But even back **then**, I couldn't help but look up at the marvelous matrices of constellations and stand in **awe** of "what God had **wrought**"! No wonder St. Paul could write in Rom. 1:20, "For ever since the world was created, people have **seen** the earth and sky. Through everything God made, they can **clearly** see His invisible qualities—His eternal **power** and **divine nature**. So, they have no excuse for **NOT** knowing God."

Every time I step out of my house and gaze at that celestial **carpet** of twinkling stars on our clear foothill nights, I can almost hear the Creator ordering me to, *"Take your limitations off of what I can do for you!"* It reminds me of Abraham in Gen. 15. His faith in God had lagged. He thought he'd **NEVER** have an heir. And so, in a **vision** one **night**, God dragged him out from under the limitations of his tent's ceiling to a hilltop field to gaze at the night sky filled with more stars than any human being could even **imagine**, **challenging** Abraham to believe God's promise to give him numbers of **descendants** like **THAT!** St. Paul says in Romans 9 that Abraham got his **wish**, because the billions of believers throughout the years are **ALSO** called *"children of Abraham"* through their faith in Christ.

FAITH allows God's people to get out of their **tents** (**AND** church **doors**) and to entertain **eternal possibilities**, even while some brilliant **physicists DON'T...those astrophysicists** who still **remain TONE DEAF** to *"the music of the spheres"* or **BLIND** to the full spectrum of *"the fearfully and wonderfully made world"* **around** them...a universe that's **overflowing** with the miracles not only of God's **unlimited POWER** but **especially** the miracle of God's unlimited **GRACE and SALVATION** in our only Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
