

Unjust Suffering: Sharing An Experience With Christ Matthew 27:1-26

- 1) Jesus declared guilty by the Jews (Matt. 27:1-2)
- 2) Jesus affirmed innocent by the Romans (27:23; cf. John 18:38)
- 3) All are judged sinners unto death by actions (27:3-10)
- 4) Jesus declares sinners righteous through faith (Rom. 3:21-31)
- 5) All Christians will "suffer for His sake" (Phil. 1:29)
- 6) Christ suffered unjustly; He sympathizes with our weakness (Heb. 4:15)
 - a) God uses our circumstances for our good and His glory
 - b) You get no credit for being patient if you are beaten for doing wrong. But if you suffer for doing good and endure it patiently, God is pleased with you (1 Pet. 2:20, NLT).
- 7) Application: sharing sorrows with Christ
 - a) Don't miss an opportunity to do the right thing (e.g., Pilate, Judas)
 - b) Suffer as an evangelistic endeavor (27:14; cf. Phil. 1:12)
 - c) Forget justice on earth; God's kingdom is in the next world
 - i) Just speak truth for the kingdom of God without fear
 - ii) Avoid bitterness and anger, entrusting your circumstances to God
 - d) Stop demanding to be heard, defending yourself
 - i) Credibility is lost in our loud defenses
 - ii) God will decide where and when justice is had
 - e) Seek comfort in Christ
