A Love Better Than Life (Psalm 63)

- Three kinds of people in a Christian gathering:
- 1) Those who are Christians only in name
- 2) Those who follow at a distance like Peter
- 3) Those who cling to God whether there be sunshine, storm, no matter what
- These people desire God intensely because they know only He will truly satisfy
- Psalm 68 is an expression of David's heart longing for intimacy with God

I. Longing For God

- David uses the harsh desert regions of Judah as a picture of life without God
- As intense as physical thirst is, David compares it with his thirst for God
- Comparatively few Christians understand that this is where they ache the most
- There is no better way of grasping your greatest need than by pursuing God

II. Satisfaction in God

- 1000 years after David wrote these words Jesus said: ask & you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock and the door will be opened to you (Ps 68:2-8)
- The past: so I have looked upon you in your sanctuary beholding your power & glory
- <u>The present</u>: "your steadfast love is better than life" (3), "When I remember you upon my bed, & meditate on you in the watches of the night;" (v.6) you have been my help (v.7), "your right hand upholds me" (v.8)
- <u>The future</u>: "My soul will be satisfied as with the richest foods; with singing lips my mouth will praise you" (v.5) This describes David as a worshipper in that
- 1) He is satisfied with, in, and by God "God's love is better than life" (vs.3)
- He praises & exalts God freely "...I will praise you" (vs3 & vs7) the result (vs.8)
- 2) He desires closeness to God: "My soul clings to you; your right hand upholds me"

III. Vindication By God

- Vs 9-11 David expresses his confidence in God who will destroy his enemies
- It is here & now that God's grace will satisfy us, even while we live a fallen world
- While Absalom sought to murder his father, David found the Lord's love satisfying
- Midst the murderous cries of those who crucified Christ He still clung to the Father
- Even when the Father forsook Him, He trusted & believed & God exalted Him
