Ten Men of Name-5:1-6:4
The Story of Noah-5:1-10:32
Introduction: This longer section (5:1-10:32) includes the $2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}$, and $4^{\text {th }}$ toledoth markers ( $5: 1 ; 6: 9 ; 10: 1$ ). This particular lesson will address only the $2^{\text {nd }}$ toledoth which was a written record or book (5:1).

1) Prologue-5:1-3
a) Review of chapters $1-2-5: 1-2$
i) Emphasis on God's work-5:1-2 (created, blessed, named)
ii) Emphasis on God's likeness-5:1b
(1) The image of God was not destroyed, only distorted
iii) Emphasis on two genders-5:2a
b) Adam's age (130) at the birth of Seth-5:3 (cf. 4:25-26)
i) Adam lived to be 930 (cf. 5:5)
2) Sons of Adam—5:4-32 (cf. $1^{\text {st }}$ Chronicles 1:1-4; Luke 3:36-38)
a) Uniquities of this list
i) Each description (with notable exceptions) follows the same pattern
(1) His name; his age at the birth of his first son; his remaining lifespan plus other children; his age at death
ii) Note the reign of death, but with one exception (cf. 2:17; 3:4; Romans 5:14; 6:23)
iii) Compared with the genealogy of Cain (cf. 4:16-24)
b) Generations of this list
i) Adam and his additional anonymous children-5:4-5
ii) Seth-5:6-8
iii) Enosh-5:9-11
iv) Cainan/Kenan-5:12-14
v) Mahalalel-5:15-17
vi) Jared-5:18-20
vii) Enoch—5:21-24 (cf. with Lamech, the $7^{\text {th }}$ from Adam through Cain; 4:19-24)
(1) His life of faith (cf. Hebrews 11:5) (cf. with Noah in 6:9)
(2) His non-death (cf. $2^{\text {nd }}$ Kings 2)
(3) His prophesy (cf. Jude 1:14-15)
viii) Methuselah-5:25-27 (perhaps means "when he dies, it will be sent")
(1) Oldest recorded person in the Bible
ix) Lamech-5:28-31
(1) Only explanation in list for naming his son; play on word sounds for naming Noah
(2) Adam died when Lamech was 56 years old; Seth died 14 years before Noah
x) Noah-5:32
(1) His sons are not listed in chronological order (i.e. Japheth, Shem, Ham)
(2) Cf. $2^{\text {nd }}$ Peter $2: 5$
3) Assuming a strict chronology in this list, the Flood probably took place 1,656 years after creation.
