### The Fear of God

"Great fear came upon all the church, and upon as many as heard these things."

(Acts 5:11)

hat is it to fear God? Natural-minded sinners have no fear of God, Romans 3:18. Many are religionists that have no fear of God because they have been told by false witnesses that once they make their decision for Jesus they are as good for Heaven as their own name and therefore need not fear. They are told that to doubt is a sin and so they should trust in their decision. Worldlings wear shirts that declare 'No Fear' boastfully declaring their independence from God and believing themselves strong enough to withstand any enemy or opposition.

The early church learned a quick lesson about not presuming before a Holy God. A couple, Ananias and Sapphira, had conspired together to make it appear that they were something they were not and God dramatically exposed their lie. He killed both suddenly and the church was just as quickly awakened and feared. What caused great fear to come upon all in the church and others who heard these things?

- 1.) The fear of God is not a mere fear of judgment but an awe and reverence of God as holy. Those given Spiritual eyes see Him as a God Who is a consuming fire and Who sees sinners for who they are; not as they appear to be to others. His holy justice exposes all men as deceivers, liars and hypocrites with no place to hide, <u>Hebrews 12:28-29</u>.
- 2.) The fear of God is the beginning of wisdom, <u>Proverbs 9:10</u>. Those taught by the Spirit are made wise to the character and holiness of God and the utter horror of God and their utter abhorrence before Him as sinners. They are brought to confess that should God take account of their iniquity, none could stand, <u>Psalm 130:3</u>. So holy is God and so sinful is man that nothing less than the death of His Son would or could justify those that He has appointed to salvation. Killing Ananias and Sapphira was there just due because of their hypocrisy. But to consider just how God hates sin and will not

endure it, consider what He did to His own Son: He spared not His Son but delivered Him up that He might be a Just God and Savior in saving those for whom His Son died as their Substitute, Romans 8:32.

There are many today that falsely assume that they are beyond needing a Mediator between them and God. They view God as a God of Love Who waits for them to embrace His love and if they do so, then He will accept them. While it is true that God is Love, He does not compromise His holiness to love the sinner. His love is summed up in His love for His Son and those He gave to His Son to save and has come and fulfilled all that was necessary for God to love them and justify them by His Grace. Therefore, those who fear God cannot and will not approach Him in any other way than in, by and through His Son and His accomplished work at the cross, looking to Him in Christ alone for mercy, Hebrews 4:15-16.

## The Myth of Progressive Holiness

"That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit." (John 3:6)

here is no promise made that we shall be set free in this life from the in-being and the in-working of sin. Many think that they are to become progressively holier and holier, that sin after sin is to be removed gradually out of the heart until at last they are almost perfect in the flesh. But this is an idle dream; one which, sooner or later, in the case of God's people will be rudely and roughly broken to pieces. Nature will ever remain the same and we shall ever find that the flesh will lust against the Spirit. Our Adam nature is corrupt to the very core. It cannot be mended, it cannot be satisfied, it is at the last what it was at the first: inherently evil and will never cease to be corrupt until we put off mortality [the body of sin and death]. All we can hope for, yearn after, expect and pray for: is that this evil nature may be subdued, mortified, crucified and held in subjection under the Power of Grace [Christ Crucified]. But as to any such change passing upon it or taking place in it as to make it holy, it is but a pharisaic delusion which promises holiness in the flesh but leaves us still under the power of sin while it opposes with deadly enmity that True Sanctification [Christ Jesus] of the new man of Grace, which is wrought by Divine power and is utterly distinct from any fancied holiness in the flesh or any vain dream of its progressive sanctification.
