  - B. Given to those who ask (Luke 11:13; John 3:34)
  - C. Taken away through unrepentant sin (Psalm 51:10-11; also Psalm 66:18; Isaiah 59:1-2; 1 Peter 3:7; visible presence or absence of the Spirit: Genesis 15; Exodus 3; 13-14; 33; Matthew 3:16; Mark 1:10; Luke 3:22; John 1:32; Acts 2; 1 Samuel 4:21)
  - D. The Holy Spirit makes "the reality of redemption ... both present and authoritative." (Oliver O'Donovan)
- III. Obedience and the Experience of the Spirit
  - A. The sending of the Spirit "forever" comes to the whole church
  - B. Our experience of the Spirit's presence increases as we seek to obey the word of Christ.
- IV. The Testimony of the Spirit
  - A. The Spirit teaches (verses 17, 20; also John 1:38-39)
  - B. The Spirit gives peace (verse 27)
  - C. The Spirit makes Christ real to us (verses 18, 20, 21)
