(1 John 2:27)

Anointing: The Error of Pop Christianity

Symptoms

- 1. Mood altering music
- 2. Ordering the Holy Spirit around
- 3. Intense manipulation and crowd control
- 4. Makes unauthorized exagerated promises on behalf of God
- 5. Dramatics and sensationalism
- 6. Supposing 'Gain is godliness'
- 7. Extracting "seed monies"
- 8. Excusing misconduct and antics as "anointing"
- 9. Breeds discontent with "mere christianity"
- 10. Builds following of a personality vs Jesus
- 11. Anointing becomes a point of self boasting
- 12. Anointing is transferred from person to person

What The Bible Says About The Anointing

- 1. The anointing is given to every true believer
- 2. You receive the anointing from Christ
- 3. The anointing is resident in you
- 4. The anointing teaches you all things in respect to counter ing those that try to seduce you
- 5. The anointing is truth without lies
- 6. The anointing teaches us to abide in Christ
- 7. Christ is the "Anointed One"
- 8. Anointing is transferred from Christ to us first hand
- 9. Christ's same anointing is what is given to us



Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood, and hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen. (Revelations 1:5-6)

And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up: and, as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read.

And there was delivered unto him the book of the prophet Esaias. And when he had opened the book, he found the place where it was written,

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised,

To preach the acceptable year of the Lord.

And he closed the book, and he gave it again to the minister, and sat down. And the eyes of all them that were in the synagogue were fastened on him.

And he began to say unto them, This day is this scripture fulfilled in your ears. (Luke 4:16-21)

The preacher sought to find out acceptable words: (Ecclesiastes 12:10)

The lips of the righteous know what is acceptable: but the mouth of the wicked speaketh frowardness. (Proverbs 10:32)

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God. (Romans 12:1-2)

For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light:

(For the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth;)

Proving what is acceptable unto the Lord.

And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them. (Ephesians 5:8-11)

I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men;

For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.

For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; (1 Timothy 2:1-3)

The Six Purposes of The Anointing

- 1. To preach the gospel to the poor
- 2. To heal the broken hearted
- 3. To preach deliverance to captives
- 4. To preach recovering of sight to blind
- 5. To set at liberty them that are bruised
- 6. To preach the acceptable year of the Lord

6. Preaching The Acceptable Year of The Lord

The Importance of Acceptability!

1.

Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear:

For our God is a consuming fire.(Hebrews 12:28-29)

Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ. (1 Peter 2:5)

For what glory is it, if, when ye be buffeted for your faults, ye shall take it patiently? but if, when ye do well, and suffer for it, ye take it patiently, this is acceptable with God. (1 Peter 2:20)

But in every nation he that feareth him, and worketh righteousness, is accepted with him. (Acts 10:25)

For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost.

For he that in these things serveth Christ is acceptable to God, and approved of men.

Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another. (Romans 14:17-19)

To the praise of the glory of his grace, wherein he hath made us accepted in the beloved. (Ephesians 1:5-6)

(For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.) (2 Corinthians 6:2)

But as for me, my prayer is unto thee, O LORD, in an acceptable time: O God, in the multitude of thy mercy hear me... (Psalm 69:13)

This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners; of whom I am chief. (1 Timothy 1:15)

...he that receiveth me receiveth him that sent me. (John 13:20)

But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: (John 1:12)

He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him (John 14:21) What is meant by the "Acceptable Year of The Lord?"

But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law,

To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. (Galations 4:4-5)

How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him. (Acts 10:38)

Thus saith the LORD, In an acceptable time have I heard thee, and in a day of salvation have I helped thee: and I will preserve thee, and give thee for a covenant of the people, to establish the earth, to cause to inherit the desolate heritages;

That thou mayest say to the prisoners, Go forth; to them that are in darkness, Shew yourselves. They shall feed in the ways, and their pastures shall be in all high places.

They shall not hunger nor thirst; neither shall the heat nor sun smite them: for he that hath mercy on them shall lead them, even by the springs of water shall he guide them. (Isaiah 49:8-10)

From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. (Matthew 4:17)

And all bare him witness, and wondered at the gracious words which proceeded out of his mouth. And they said, Is not this Joseph's son? (Luke 4:22)

Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world. (1 John 4:17)

...and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. (Acts 1:8)

Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; (John 14:12)

...they said, Lord, wilt thou that we command fire to come down from heaven, and consume them, even as Elias did?

But he turned, and rebuked them, and said, Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of.

For the Son of man is not come to destroy men's lives, but to save them. (Luke 9:54-56)

Behold, now is the accepted time; Behold, now is the day of salvation. (2 Corinthians 6:2)

And the servant of the Lord must not strive; but be gentle unto all men, apt to teach, patient,

In meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; (2 Timothy 2:24-25)
