The Rebel and the King
Revelation 4:11; Ephesians 2:1-3
Reading: Isaiah 55:6-7

...*pray*...

My grandfather died when I was ten.

I didn't really know him, but he seemed *nice enough*. *Thin & white haired & quiet*.

A farmer & a store-keeper. He liked *El Producto cigars & choc-covered cherries*!

After his funeral, I was playing w/ my cousins & I heard my mother & the other women talking about grandfather....was he in heaven?

They seemed pretty certain *he had made it* – he was *nice*, he had been *baptized*, he was even a *church deacon*.

Then they *compared notes* on some of the *other men* in our family. The results were *mixed*. *Not everyone* was a good as grandfather...

This just *confirmed* what *I'd suspected*.

At ten, my *religion* was pretty basic, but I *had one*! There was *God*, there was *me*; there was *heaven* & there was *hell*.

You lived. You died. God judged you. If you were good enough, you went to heaven. If you weren't good enough...let's just say you should've tried harder!

Honestly, most people have about that same religion. Try harder.

... We think God has this set of rules and if you *keep most* of them *most* of the time *–you're good to go,* because most of the time, you're *good enough*.

That's where most people live and die, hoping that they're *good to go*, because they're *good enough*.

But God says you aren't! No man or woman or boy or girl is good enough.

And God should know...He made you & He gave you the rules.

So who gets to go to heaven? Can you know that you're going, in this life, before it's too late?

The Bible says you can know! So...for the next four weeks...

Don't you even *think* about *dying* before I tell you these *six* truths (the first 2 this morning)!

- 1. God owns you.
- 2. You disowned God.
- 3. God judges sinners.
- 4. Jesus died for sinners.
- 5. Jesus lives again.
- 6. You must choose.

Again, today's two truths: God is your owner, you are a rebel.

God owns you... but why do I say that? Let's start at the beginning:

- 1. If you only had time to tell someone *one truth* about God, here is what you should say: the God of the Bible **created** *all things*!
 - a. And that's the *first truth* in the Bible. **Gen 1:1** *In the beginning, God created all things.*
 - b. That truth is repeated from the *beginning* to the *end* of the Bible.
 - c. So let's turn to **Rev 4:11** (*don't* read). The Apostle John takes us to God's heavenly *throne-room*. *Throne*. *Floor* like a *sea of crystal*. *Lightening & thunder*. Angelic *creatures*. Resurrected *saints*. *Non-stop worship!*
 - d. What is their *song!?!* (**Read.**) *Worthy...worthy are You, our Lord & God, to receive glory & honor & power.* God deserves the *worship* of *men* and *angels...*
 - e. Why? Let's reduce **v.4** down to its simplest form: You are worthy...because...You have created.
 - i. *That's* why: God is worthy because God *created all things*.
 - ii. That's the *foundation* of understanding God & man from the *first* book in the Bible to the *last*.
 - f. Now let's think about what **Gen 1 & Rev 4** (etc.) tell us about God and *man*...about God and *you*.

- 2. Because God is the creator of *everything* that also means God is *your* creator.
 - a. Back to Gen1, but this time to v.27, we read *God created* man in His own image, in the image of God He created him, male and female He create them.
 - b. When the Bible teaches that God is your Creator, it means He made you *personally* and for a *purpose*.
 - c. E.g. God said to both the *Prophet Jeremiah* & the *Apostle Paul* that He had *set these men apart from their mothers' wombs* to pursue their ministries (Jer 1:5; Gal 1:15; also Psa 139).
 - d. More generally, we are *all* created to be *stewards/managers* of God's creation and we are created to *worship* Him, alone.
- 3. That leads to the *next truth* about you & God:
 - a. If God made you (personally, w/purpose), then He owns you! If God made you He owns you...
 - b. Turn w/ me to **Psa 24:1,2 (read): v.1** the earth and its peoples (all it contains) belong to God. **Why? v.2 For** He founded it...and established it.
- 4. The teachings that God is the *creator* and *owner* of all things (people) lead to the truth that God is therefore the *judge* of all things. Abraham (Gen 18:25) called God the *just judge of all the earth.*
- 5. Let's pause to review.
 - a. Here's what we've said about God; He is *creator*, *owner*, and *judge* of all the earth.
 - b. Here's what we've said about us: we are created by God (in God's image, personally, purposefully) and owned by God.

- 6. Then these dynamics of *Creator*/creation, *owner*/owned, *judge*/steward brings us to *this*: you and I are *accountable* to God. He is *your* judge.
 - a. Last weekend my sons &I put up a *tongue &groove ceiling*. I'd **never** done that before I'd never used a *pneumatic nailer* before. The whole thing took *hours*!
 - i. A couple of times we had to *pull down a plank*, get a *fresh one*, and *start over*. Something had *gone wrong*!
 - ii. Who's going to *argue*? it was *our* project, *our* planks, & *our* time!
 - iii. You *make* it, you *own* it ... you *judge* it!
 - b. In the same way, God is **your** *judge* you are *accountable* to Him.
 - i. His *standards* are clear. They are *inscribed* on your heart (conscience) & *proclaimed* in nature & *recorded* in the Bible & *revealed* (fulfilled) in Jesus Christ.
 - ii. Jesus' summed up God's *holy standards* with these startling words (Matt 5:48) "Therefore, you are to be **perfect**, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

God is your *Creator & Owner & Judge*. He *owns* you, therefore you are accountable to Him.

Man was created to be God's *image-bearer & steward & worshiper*, but man is a *rebel*!

- 1. It started *early* & it started in the most *unlikely* of settings. Perhaps you know the story (Gen 3): the *Garden*, the first *man* & *woman*, **no** *sin*, only **one** *rule* to keep, & face-to-face *fellowship with God*. It couldn't have been *any better*!
 - a. But then our first parents listened to the *seductive voice* of the *Tempter*, and *fell*. They *defied* God & *deliberately* did the only thing God had forbidden!
 - b. The *spiritual* **DNA** of our entire human family was *marred* forever. Every one of us. *You*.
 - c. The Bible tells us that *God lovingly made us* in His own *image* & made us to serve as *stewards of His world*, and we *rebelled*.
 - d. So now we are all *rebels* by nature and *rebels* by action.
- 2. The Bible calls your rebellion *sin*. "Sin" was an archer's (soldier's) word. It meant to "miss the target." The target is what God requires of you what He'll hold you accountable for (e.g. **10** Commandments, or "you shall be perfect as your heavenly...").
 - a. The Bible says we all miss God's mark! "For all have..."
 - b. Sometimes you *miss* it thru *open rebellion*. You *willfully* break His laws. → Telling a *lie* to avoid blame is a clear example. *Cheating* on a test or *shoplifting* are other examples.
 - c. Often you sin by *playing god* yourself. You make your own *rules*; you set your own *standards*. Excusing your *immorality* because *everyone else* is doing it. ... Or maybe you just *bury* your head in the sand & *pretend* none of this matters...at least not *today*.

- 3. I've said a couple of times that *everyone sins*. Therefore, everyone stands *guilty* under God's judgment. Am I *exaggerating*? Are you really in *peril*? Let's see what God says about that. → turn w/ me to Eph 2:1-3.
 - a. **V.1** says you were *spiritually dead* in your *sins*. What can dead people do *nothing*! You can't do *anything* to meet God's standards.
 - b. **V.2** reveals that you were *under the sway* of Satan, *walking according to the world*.
 - c. Which leads to *this* sad picture (3): you were children of wrath, i.e. under God's judgment.
 - d. In a very clear and comprehensive way, the apostle says there is only *one* kind of person in the world (v.3 *all*). There is only *one* kind of person in the world *dead to God, pursuing the* world, *under wrath*! The *wrath* of a *Holy Judge*.
 - e. And if something doesn't change, that's me, you ... all of us.
- 4. Maybe you're still skeptical. "I'm not such a bad person!" "I go to church!" "I work hard!" "I'm reforming my bad habits!" "Hey—I'm a lot better than some people I could tell you about!"
 - a. Jesus taught that the *human heart* has a *dangerous tendency*: to look at God's Law only on the *surface* & **not** admit that the truth judges you from the *inside*, *out* from the *heart* to the *hand* from *motive* to *action*. Let me *explain* what I mean...
 - b. The *first* part of the Ten Commandments deal with your relationship to *God*. Do you worship God the way He *deserves* to be worshipped? Here's a *test:* have you ever *spoken His name* in a *profane* or *careless* way?

- c. God's commandments also have a lot to say about your relationships & personal morals. → Do you honor your parents? Here's another test: Ever been slow/sloppy on obeying their directions? Made fun of your mother's worry & concern. Ever sworn at your father under your breath?
- d. Do you *lie*? How about *bending* or *editing* the truth to smooth your way? **Jesus** said just let your "yes be yes & your no be no"
- e. Are you a *fornicator* or *adulterer?* No!?! Do you *lust* in your *imaginations?* Are you *impure* about where/what you *look*?
- f. Do you *covet?* → "Consuming desire for something you can't have (possession, position, power, status, etc.)." Remember the Rich Young Ruler? "All these things I've kept from my youth up!" Jesus: "One thing you lack sell all you possess & come, follow Me." The Rich Young Ruler went away grieving, because He owned much... He refused to seek & follow God on God's terms, because he cared more for what he possessed. He was covetous.
- 5. Please *drop* your defenses for just a moment & let me *press* these truths into your *mind* & *heart*:
 - a. "You shall be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.
 - b. Yet... "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

God is your Creator & Owner & Judge.

Unbeliever - you are a rebel. You aren't following God the way He commands & deserves.

What does a King do with a *rebel*? What will God do with <u>you</u>? I want to *explore* that with you next Sunday morning.

I've gotten lot of visual feedback in the past half-hour!

Many of you have *gladly agreed* with all of this – because it reminds you that Christ has *rescued* you from your sins.

But some of you are *uneasy*, *worried*, *self-distracted*; not everyone is *comfortable* yet...

Does all of this make you *squirm*? Then *you* are the *very one* I want to talk to this morning!

God has the *answer* for your need. He lovingly *sent* His Son Jesus to *die* to *bear the punishment* deserved by sinners. **By you...**

God raised Jesus from the dead & He's alive **today** to offer you forgiveness & eternal life.

Your part is to *believe* that He died for you, to *turn* to Him & to *trust/follow* Him as your Savior & Lord. **His part** is to *accept* you & give you a new *heart/life*. And *He will*!

You must choose: your way or His. Please stop putting Him off. He is a loving Savior - please follow Christ.
