Key Thought

Our simple prayers can have astonishing results . . . when we follow Jesus' principles for prayer.



Effective prayer is intensely personal—it flows from a vital relationship with God (6:5-6).

- When we pray to impress people, we'll never impress the heart of God.
- We're invited to direct our prayers to God as our Father, a term of personal relationship.
- Our personal prayers must shut out distractions.
- God has promised to hear and answer our prayers.



Effective prayer is richly meaningful—it depends on heartfelt intimacy with God (6:7-8).

- God does not honor empty words or many words when we pray.
- Our prayers should be simple, heartfelt, and confident because God knows our needs.



Effective prayer is deeply spiritual—it reflects Jesus' model of communication with God (6:9-13).

- Jesus taught us to pray to our Father for His glory to be known on earth (6:9-10).
- Jesus taught us to pray to our Father for our needs to be met on earth (6:11-13).



Effective prayer is extremely practical—it relies on the transforming power of God (6:14-15).

- Our ability to forgive others is a mark of true faith.
- Those who do not forgive have not truly experienced God's forgiveness.
- Through faith God transforms our lives so that we can forgive graciously and pray effectively.
