  - 1. Why would Jesus be reluctant to openly tell these people that He is the Christ? 2:24-25 16:25,29 6:14-15
  - 2. He reveals Himself to those with prepared hearts. 4:26 9:36 Mark 8:30 Mt. 16:13ff
- C. Jesus has already provided them with all the proof that they need to draw the correct conclusion. v. 25 18:20 1:11

  - 1. After telling them about Himself, Jesus tells them about themselves.

  - 3. They are excluded from the blessings of God's flock. v. 11, 26-28

  - 5. If eyewitnesses would not believe, you should not be surprised when people don't receive God's Word from us. Mt. 10:25
  - 6. They are fully responsible for their rejection of Jesus. Acts 2:23

### III. Those who hear and follow Christ are His sheep. v. 27

- A. The Good Shepherd's sheep are branded.

    - a. Every single sheep hears and comes. 6:37,39,44 10:3-4 9:38
    - b. Evangelism is Jesus' voice to His sheep. Acts 13:48 Eph. 2:17
  - 2. Their feet follow Him. 8:12 12:26 Phil. 1:6 Titus 2:14
    - a. Perseverance of the saints goes beyond eternal security.
    - b. Those who have been renewed by the Spirit have a new nature. 2 Co. 5:17
    - c. Jesus is their Shepherd (Lord) Whom they delight to obey (follow). 14:15 8:12 1:37-38 Mt. 4:19-22 19:21-22,27-28 Mark 8:34
- B. Do you believe in order to become a sheep or do you believe because you are a sheep?
  - 1. The Father chose you and gave you to the Son. v. 29a 6:37 Eph. 1:4 Rom. 8:29-30
  - 2. The Son laid down His life to redeem you. 10:11 Acts 20:28 Rev. 5:9
  - 3. The Spirit renews you (the new birth) and gives you a new nature. 1:12-13 3:3-8 5:25 II Co. 5:17 1 Pe. 1:3 Rom. 6:1ff
  - 4. Regeneration takes place in connection with the Gospel Word. <u>Js. 1:18</u> <u>1 Pet. 1:23</u> Acts 13:48

- C. Are you Jesus' sheep?

## IV. If you are Jesus' sheep, you are secure. v. 28-30

- A. You are known (loved) by the Lord. v. 27b, 14 Eph. 1:4ff Rom. 8:29-30 Amos 3:2 Mt. 7:23 Gal. 4:9 Ps. 1:6 34:6
- B. You have received eternal life from Him. v. 28a 3:15-16 5:39 6:51,58 8:51-52 11:25-26 17:3 I Co. 15:22 Ro. 6:23 Gal. 2:21
  - 1. We who were spiritually dead have been made alive by grace. 5:25 Eph. 2:1f
  - 2. The life He gives you is abundant and never ending. 10:10b 11:25-26
- C. You most certainly will not perish. v. 28b-29 6:39 17:12 2 Tim. 1:12
  - 1. Sheep are vulnerable to many dangers. v. 12
  - 2. The Son keeps you secure. v. 28b 6:37-40 17:12 Rom. 8:31f 2 Tim. 2:13,19 1 Pe. 1:3-5 Isa. 49:16
  - 3. The Father keeps you secure. v. 29-30 I Pet. 1:3-5 Dt. 33:3 Col. 3:3 Isa. 43:13 Phil 1:6 Ro. 8:35ff Ps. 121:4
  - 4. You have been sealed by the Holy Spirit. Eph. 1:13-14
  - 5. Eternal life depends not on your hold on Christ, but on His firm grip on you. *The perseverance of the saints is really the perseverance of the Savior.*
- D. God the Father and God the Son are united in saving you. v. 30 5:18-23
  - 1. Jesus implies that He is equal to God the Father. 1:1ff 8:58 20:28 17:10,22
  - 2. The Jews get His point, but they don't like it.
- E. The response illustrates the truth that some are sheep and some are not. v. 31-42
  - 1. Those who are not sheep reject the Good Shepherd. v. 31-39
  - 2. His sheep believe. v. 40-42 1:7 3:30
