	Serve – (douleuo) a verb meaning "to function as a servant or slave to another". (Gal. 5:13)
3.	Your primary of ministry/service is always the Lord Jesus Christ. (1Cor. 6:19-20; Gal. 1:10; Col. 3:23-24; James 1:1; 2Pet. 1:1)
4.	Your secondary object of ministry/service is (Gal. 6:1-2, 10; Titus 3:8, 14)
