"It [Exodus 34:6-7] is much less well known...Probably many Christians are completely unfamiliar with it. This is regrettable, not only because it is one of the most important passages in the whole Bible but also because among many Christians there are serious misconceptions about the character of God in the Old Testament that proper attention to this key moment of revelation could correct. The popular notion that the God of the Hebrew Bible is characterized by vengeance and wrath, while the God of the New Testament is, by contrast, a God of love is a travesty that deserves to be vigorously refuted. It certainly cannot survive attention to the definitive account of God's character that was given to Moses at Mt. Sinai in Exodus 34...It provides in fact the fullest description of God's character to be found anywhere in the Bible. It probably tells us more about God than does anything else in the Old Testament."

"Evil rolls across the ages, but so does good. Good has its own momentum. Corruption never wholly succeeds. (Even blasphemers acknowledge God.) Creation is stronger than sin and grace stronger still. Creation and grace are anvils that have worn out a lot of our hammers. To speak of sin by itself, to speak of it apart from the realities of creation and grace, is to forget the resolve of God. God wants shalom and will pay any price to get it back. Human sin is stubborn, but not as stubborn as the grace of God and not half so persistent, not half so ready to suffer to win its way. Moreover, to speak of sin by itself is to misunderstand its nature: sin is only a parasite, a vandal, a spoiler. Sinful life is a partly depressing, partly ludicrous caricature of genuine human life. To concentrate on our rebellion, defection, and folly—to say to the world, 'I have some bad news and I have some bad news'--is to forget that the center of the Christian religion is not our sin but our Savior. To speak of sin without grace is to minimize the resurrection of Jesus Christ, the fruit of the Spirit, and the hope of shalom.

But to speak of grace without sin is surely no better. To do this is to trivialize the cross of Jesus Christ, to skate past all the struggling by good people down the ages to forgive, accept, and rehabilitate sinners, including themselves, and therefore to cheapen the grace of God that always comes to us with blood on it. What had we thought the ripping and writhing on Golgotha were all about? To speak of grace without looking squarely at these realities, without painfully honest acknowledgment of our own sin and its effects, is to shrink grace to a mere embellishment of the music of creation, to shrink it down to a mere grace note. In short, for the Christian church to ignore, euphemize, or otherwise mute the lethal reality of sin is to cut the nerve of the gospel. For the sober truth is that without full disclosure on sin, the gospel of grace becomes impertinent, unnecessary, and finally uninteresting."

HEIDELBERG CATECHISM | Lord's Day 31

Question 83

What are the keys of the kingdom?

The preaching of the holy gospel and Christian discipline toward repentance. Both of them open the kingdom of heaven to believers and close it to unbelievers.

Question 84

How does preaching the holy gospel open and close the kingdom of heaven?

According to the command of Christ, The kingdom of heaven is opened by proclaiming and publicly declaring to all believers, each and every one, that, as often as they accept the gospel promise in true faith, God, because of Christ's merit, truly forgives all their sins.

The kingdom of heaven is closed, however, by proclaiming and publicly declaring to unbelievers and hypocrites that, as long as they do not repent, the wrath of God and eternal condemnation rest on them. God's judgment, both in this life and in the life to come, is based on this gospel testimony.

Question 85

How is the kingdom of heaven closed and opened by Christian discipline?

According to the command of Christ: Those who, though called Christians, profess unchristian teachings or live unchristian lives, and who after repeated personal and loving admonitions, refuse to abandon their errors and evil ways, and who after being reported to the church, that is, to those ordained by the church for that purpose, fail to respond also to the church's admonitions—such persons the church excludes from the Christian community by withholding the sacraments from them, and God also excludes them from the kingdom of Christ. Such persons, when promising and demonstrating genuine reform, are received again as members of Christ and of his church.

THE SUFFERING CHURCH

"Pray without ceasing." 1 Thessalonians 5:17

FOR AUGUST:

Nigeria

• Daily violence against and kidnappings of Christians is a continuing trend. 13 Christians per day, 372 per month on average are taken by force from their families and communities. Pray for the church and for its pastors, that God would bring protection, encouragement and resilience in the face of such injustice and suffering.

North Korea

- Dozens of North Korean Chrisitans were arrested and shot at a secret worship service. Later their families were rounded up and arrested, sent to political prisons to make an example to discourage others.
- Please pray for two men involved in a safe house ministry in China for North Koreans who cross the border. They are struggling with health issues and were recently arrested. Pray for endurance and that their ministry would continuing bear fruit and providing a refuge for North Koreans who are able to escape their home country.

Eritrea

• Church leaders and believers are targets for extremists. Pray for boldness and courage for our brother and sisters as they face regular hardship and opposition.

Kyrgyzstan

- A brother and sister had to flee their home because their father physically attacked them for their faith in Jesus. Pray for believers who must choose between their earthly family and the family of God
- A Christian man was denied the right to bury his brother or attend his mother's funeral because he is a believer. He has been driven away from his village and exiled. Lift up the many who face outrageous abuse and the many painful moments they have to endure.

Iraq

• A new believer was found murdered by her family members because of her conversion. Ask the Lord to produce outrage against such honor killings, so that they no longer tolerated or even considered.

Africa

• Many countries in Africa are dominated by a militant wing of Islam. Christian believers are expelled from their families when they respond to the gospel, and subsequently grieve and lament the loss of connections and closeness to their family and friends. Pray that God would build up His people to be a family that can withstand such pressures, and that He would protect pastors and leaders who are often specifically targeted.

India

• Christians here have faced increasing persecution over the past four years. Many incidents have been sparked by Hindu nationalists who oppose any non-Hindu influence in India. Please pray for the gospel to grow in influence and acceptance in this culture. Believers often have no legal or practical recourse when they are attacked.
