PSALM 63 | A SONG OF THIRST

Background: In Psalm 63, King David cried out to God from a place of sensing isolation from God. This psalm can be very meaningful to us as we go through ups and downs, experiencing seasons of great joy as well as dry seasons.

2. Affirmation of God and how He satisfies (2-8)
3. Confidence in the victory of those on God's side (9-11)
