# Revelation 2:18 – 3:6

The Churches at Thyatira and Sardis

## Introduction

- We are in the 1<sup>st</sup> Vision of the Book (1:9-3:22).
- Chapters 2-3 describe situations in the 7 churches of Asia Minor that are representative of problems that all churches from Pentecost until the Rapture will face.
- Each letter has a primary association to the local church addressed.
- Each letter has a personal application to any church anywhere as well as to the individuals in any church.

#### Introduction

- We have read and endeavored to personally apply the letters to the churches of Ephesus, Smyrna, and Pergamos.
- Today we read the letters to the churches of Thyatira and Sardis.
- Let's review their location on the following map.

**Revelation 2:18** "And to the angel of the church in Thyatira write, These things says the Son of God, who has eyes like a flame of fire, and His feet like fine brass:

- <sup>19</sup> "I know your works, love, service, faith, and your patience; and *as* for your works, the last *are* more than the first.
- <sup>20</sup> "Nevertheless I have a few things against you, because you allow that woman Jezebel, who calls

herself a prophetess, to teach and seduce My servants to commit sexual immorality and eat things sacrificed to idols.

- <sup>21</sup> "And I gave her time to repent of her sexual immorality, and she did not repent.
- <sup>22</sup> "Indeed I will cast her into a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her into great tribulation, unless they repent of their deeds.

- <sup>23</sup> "I will kill her children with death, and all the churches shall know that I am He who searches the minds and hearts. And I will give to each one of you according to your works.
- <sup>24</sup> "Now to you I say, and to the rest in Thyatira, as many as do not have this doctrine, who have not known the depths of Satan, as they say, I will put on you no other burden.

- <sup>25</sup> "But hold fast what you have till I come.
- <sup>26</sup> "And he who overcomes, and keeps My works until the end, to him I will give power over the nations—
- <sup>27</sup> `He shall rule them with a rod of iron; They shall be dashed to pieces like the potter's vessels '-- as I also have received from My Father;
- <sup>28</sup> "and I will give him the morning star.

<sup>29</sup> "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."


"This is the Word of God for the People of God"

- **Thyatria** is located about 40 miles southeast of Pergamos in modern turkey.
- It was a well-known center for numerous trade guilds (like unions).
- Potters, tanners, bronze workers, and dyers had their trade guild in Smyrna.
- Thyatria was famous for the manufacture of purple dye.

- Pagan festivals and immoral practices connected with membership in the trade guilds made living in Thyatria difficult for Christians.
- If Christians did not participate in the guilds, they had little to no job security.
- Thyatira was the least important of the seven cities, but it receives the longest letter.

- When Paul reached the city of **Philippi**, to begin his evangelization outreach there, he went outside the city to the riverside.
- Acts 16:13: And on the Sabbath day we went out of the city to the riverside, where prayer was customarily made; and we sat down and spoke to the women who met *there*.

• Acts 16:14 Now a certain woman named Lydia heard us. She was a seller of purple from the city of Thyatira, who worshiped God. The Lord opened her heart to heed the things spoken by Paul.







- Jesus' self-description (2:18)
- "These things says the Son of God, who has eyes like a flame of fire, and His feet like fine brass"
- It expresses the <u>penetrating insight</u> of the one who is **sovereign**, not only over the seven churches but over the entire course of history as well.
- Jesus Christ with feet of judgment is moving through His church to exercise His chastening authority upon sin and to bring comfort to the righteous.

Jesus' self-description (2:23)

"all the churches shall know that I am He who searches the minds and hearts. And I will give to each one of you according to your works."

- "searches the minds and hearts" knows your innermost thoughts and motives.
- Nothing is hidden from His penetrating gaze.

- Jesus' commendation (2:19)
- <sup>19</sup> "I know your <u>works</u>, <u>love</u>, <u>service</u>, <u>faith</u>, and your <u>patience</u>; and *as* for your works, the last *are* more than the first.
- Works active church
- Love proper motivation
- Service serving church
- Faith believed the right message about Jesus
- Patience endured in the midst of trials

- Jesus' evaluation and warning (2:20-23)
- <sup>20</sup> "Nevertheless I have a few things against you, because you **allow** that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess, to teach and seduce My servants to commit sexual immorality and eat things sacrificed to idols.
- <sup>21</sup> "And I gave her time to repent of her sexual immorality, and she did not repent.

- Jesus' evaluation and warning (2:20-23)
- <sup>22</sup> "Indeed I will cast her into a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her into great tribulation, unless they repent of their deeds.
- <sup>23</sup> "I will kill her children with death,
- Allowed a woman named "Jezebel" a selfproclaimed prophetess – "to teach" "to seduce" my servants.
- Her message Christian love tolerates and allows immorality. ("Loving, accepting, inclusive")

- A Call to Faithfulness and a Promise of Reward (2:24-29)
- <sup>24</sup> "Now to you I say, and to the rest in Thyatira, as many as do not have this doctrine, who have not known the depths of Satan, as they say, I will put on you no other burden.
- <sup>25</sup> "But hold fast what you have till I come.
- <sup>26</sup> "And <u>he who overcomes</u>, and <u>keeps My works</u> until the end, to him I will give power over the nations—

- A Call to Faithfulness and a Promise of Reward (2:24-29)
- <sup>27</sup> `He shall <u>rule them</u> with a rod of iron; They shall be dashed to pieces like the potter's vessels '-- as I also have received from My Father;
- <sup>28</sup> "and I will give him the morning star.
- "rule" authority in Christ's future kingdom
- "morning star" assurance of Christ's presence.

- Jesus' call to listen (2:29)
- <sup>29</sup> "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."

#### Background about Sardis

- Sardis was the ancient capital of Lydia and was an important and wealthy city.
- It was located on a commercial trade route.
- Much of its wealth came from its textile manufacturing, dye industry and jewelry trade.
- Today only a small village known as Sart exists amid the ancient ruins.





Jesus' self-description (3:1a)

"These things says He who has the seven Spirits of God and the seven stars"

- Jesus' evaluation and warning (3:1b-2)
- "I know your works, that you have a name that you are alive, but you are dead.
- <sup>2</sup> "Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, that are ready to die, for I have not found your works perfect before God.

- A Call to remember and repentance (3:3)
- <sup>3</sup> "Remember therefore how you have received and heard; hold fast and repent. Therefore if you will not watch, I will come upon you as a thief, and you will not know what hour I will come upon you."

- A commendation for the faithful few and a promise (3:4-5)
- <sup>4</sup> "You have a few names even in Sardis who have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with Me in white, for they are worthy.
- <sup>5</sup> "He who overcomes shall be clothed in white garments, and I will not blot out his name from the Book of Life; but I will confess his name before My Father and before His angels.

- A call to listen (3:6)
- <sup>6</sup> "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."
