1 Corinthians 15:20-28 OT: Psalm 45

Theme: In Adam we experienced all the consequences of sin: separation from God, condemnation, suffering and death. From the 2nd Adam flow the blessings of our union with Christ: justification, eternal life and renewal in the image of God. We live in the restoration of the promises of God for life and blessing in him.

Introduction: When the gifts just keep coming!

- I. The Gift of Righteousness
 - A. The Covenant of Works: Failure
 - Adam's Calling: Priest Prophet King
 - 2. Adam's Position: Our Covenant Representative
 - a. Who disobeyed God and brought us death
 - b. Whose fallen nature we inherited as we are "in Adam"
 - B. The Covenant of Grace: Triumph
 - 1. Christ, Our Representative: One Who Cannot Fail
 - a. To save his people from their sins (Matthew 1:21)
 - b. To do the Father's will (John 6:38)
 - c. Sent in time, into our world (Isaiah 42:6)
 - 2. Restoring What Was Promised (and Lost)
 - a. Gift of righteousness (Romans 5:17)
 - 1) He is "our righteousness" (1 Corinthians 1:30)
 - 2) In him we become the righteousness of God (2 Corinthians 5:21)
 - b. Justification of life as a free gift (Romans 5:18)
- II. Resurrection Life to Come (21-23)
 - A. Jesus, the First fruits
 - 1. Offered in anticipation of the full harvest (Exodus 23:19; Leviticus 23:10)
 - 2. We await the full harvest! (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)
 - B. Jesus, Raised to God's Right Hand
 - 1. Man made a little lower than the angels (Psalm 8:5, 6)

We don't see that right now (Romans 8:20, 21)

- 2. Christ is crowned with glory and honor! (Hebrews 2:9)
 - a. Ascending to God's right hand! (1 Corinthians 15:27)
 - b. Above all earthly and heavenly powers (Ephesians 1:20-22)
- 3. We are raised up with him! (Ephesians 2:6)

With authority to judge angels (1 Corinthians 6:3)

- C. The Lamb's Bride
 - 1. Christ and His Bride (Ephesians 5:31)

Pure and spotless, without stain

- 2. Restored to paradise (Revelation 21:9; 22:1-4)
 - a. The water of life (Christ Jesus himself)
 - b. The tree of life (eternal life)
 - c. Abundance!
- III. New Life Now
 - A. God's Image Renewed in Us
 - 1. Christ, the Image of the Invisible God (Colossians 1:15)
 - a. As true God

- b. In his incarnation
- 2. Image of God Marred in Us
 - a. Not destroyed
 - b. But disabled
- 3. The Spirit of Christ in Us (1 Corinthians 15:45)
 - a. Granting a life-giving Spirit
 - b. A new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17; Romans 8:9)

As a new creation:

- B. God's Calling is Restored (Colossians 3:10; Ephesians 4:24)
 - 1. Knowledge
 - a. Adam failed to proclaim and uphold the truth
 - b. Christ proclaimed and upheld the perfect will of God (John 15:15)
 - c. We are his witnesses! (Romans 15:14; Ephesians 1:17; 2 Corinthians 2:14)
 - 2. Righteousness
 - Adam was called to a kingly rule
 But sin reigned in and through Adam
 - b. Christ establishes righteousness and justice
 He rewards obedience and punishes disobedience
 - c. His people are delivered from bondage Sin no longer *reigns* over us (Romans 6:11-14)
 - 3. Holiness
 - a. Adam met with God in the garden: a priestly role
 - b. Christ, our perfect high priest
 The perfect mediator, the perfect sacrifice for sins
 - c. Our priestly office and privilege is restored!
 - 1) We are God's temple (1 Corinthians 3:16, 17; Ephesians 2:22)
 - 2) We have access to God (Hebrews 4:16; 1 Peter 2:9)

IV. The Power of the New Life

- A. To grow in the knowledge of the Lord your God: with the power to make him known
- B. To exercise dominion wherever God gives us responsibility
 - 1. A God honoring, life exalting exercise of authority
 - 2. Upholding righteousness, truth, and justice
 - 3. To worship in Spirit and in truth
 - a. The barrier of sin has been removed
 - b. The curtain that barred our entry has been opened (Hebrews 10:19-22)
