**Sermon Series: Romans** 

**Sermon Text:** Romans 1:8 Grateful for God's Grace in Others

Spiritual communion of saints stirs gratitude to God for His grace in others.

- 1) Gratitude is a priority of the Christian life.
  - a) "First"
  - b) Rom. 6:17; 7:25
  - c) Ingratitude and idolatry (1:21)
  - d) Application:
    - i) "Grace" (charis) and "thanks" (eucharistia) are not only semantically related, the one gives rise to the other.
    - ii) Are you known for grumbling or gratitude?
    - iii) Are your prayers weighted on the front end with gratitude?
- 2) Gratitude is expressed to God through Jesus Christ.
  - a) "I thank my God through Jesus Christ"
  - b) Rom. 7:25; Col. 3:17; Heb. 13:15
  - c) Application:
    - i) Do you approach God with reverence for His holiness?
    - ii) Do you approach God knowing the cost Jesus paid?
    - iii) Do you approach God knowing the present intercessions of Jesus for you?
- 3) Gratitude is expressed for all God's people.
  - a) "for all of you"
  - b) 1 Cor. 1:4; Eph. 1:16; Phil. 1:3; Col. 1:3; 1 Thess. 1:2; 2:13; 2 Thess. 1:3; 2:13; Philemon 4
  - c) Application:
    - i) Are you uncharitably critical of fellow Christians or graciously grateful?
    - ii) Are you invested in the lives of others for their Christian maturity?
- 4) Gratitude is expressed for the public faith of God's people.
  - a) "because your faith is proclaimed in all the world"
  - b) 1 Thess. 1:2-10
  - c) Faith is a gift of God otherwise Paul would not thank God for it.
  - d) Application:
    - i) Are you jealous of the influence of other Christians/churches or are you grateful for your station and theirs in God's providence?
    - ii) Are you controlled more by fear of the world's mantra or by gratitude for the proclamation of the gospel by word and deed through the Church?

**Spiritual communion of saints stirs gratitude to God for His grace in others.** How can you grow deeper in the communion of saints?
