I. THE GOD OF GRACE CALLS YOU

- A. God calls you personally through His servants: Prov. 8:4; Rev. 3:30; 2 Cor. 5:20
 - 1. His call is urgent: Ho
 - 2. His call is personal: everyone that thirsteth

II. THE GOD OF GRACE CALLS YOU TO GREAT GRACE

- A. His call is with good intention: come ye to the waters
 - 1. The waters, wine and milk all picture the Gospel waters of His great grace
 - a. grace is undeserved goodness to the guilty
 - b. grace is God's taking us from the greatest evil to highest good
 - c. grace is not only applying to the future (vs. 2)
- B. Take note: His grace is not always available (vs. 6-7)

III. YOU ARE CALLED TO RECEIVE HIS GRACE FREELY

- A. God's offers need to be received will they benefit you
 - 1. He calls us to come, buy, eat (vs. 1), delight (vs. 2), incline, hear (vs. 3)

C. I have no conviction of my sin worth speaking of
D. What then must I do to be saved?
