Richard Phillips "If we learn nothing else from the opening words of Jesus' prayer, we should notice that in Jesus' mind, the chief end of his saving work - and therefore the primary goal of our salvation - is the glory of God the Father."

Philippians 2:8-9 8 And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to *the point of* death, even the death of the cross. 9 Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, (NKJV)

D.A. Carson "Eternal life is best seen not as everlasting life but as knowledge of the Everlasting One. To know God transforms a person and introduces him to a life he could not otherwise experience."
