The Beatitudes: "Blessed Are Those Who Are Persecuted for Righteousness' Sake" Matthew 5:10-12

The life and character of the Christian described indirectly

- 1. Blessedness Gk: MAKARIOS "blessed" "happy" "completely fulfilled"
 - One to whom God has drawn near, one whom God has drawn near to Himself;

- One in whom God is evidently working

3. The Privilege Bestowed and Enjoyed

(1) Jesus urges a rejoicing!

"Rejoice and be exceedingly glad ... !"

(2) Great Reward!

The Kingdom is ours! Great heavenly reward is ours!

v.10 "theirs is the kingdom of heaven"v.12 "for great is your reward in heaven"

2. The Characteristic indicating Blessedness: Persecuted!

- (1) The place and significance of this characteristic:
 - The character of the Christian indirectly described. i.e., this is how the world reacts
 - 3rd mention of "righteousness"
 - A kind of "final test" as to character
 - Closely connected with the culminating description: "peacemaker"

Further Application:

(2) The Reason for Persecution: Righteousness (v. 10) // Devotion to Christ (v. 11)

-1- Persecuted because true righteousness is evidenced in the life

How does it show itself? Particularly in the characteristics already cited!

The world is offended because of Christ!

-2- Why is the righteous man persecuted?

- Paradox! A peacemaker, but one who divides! Matt. 10:34-35
