Mark 16:1-8 — "He's Not Here; He Is Risen! How the Resurrection of Jesus Changes Everything!"

Without the resurrection, the life and death of Jesus, though noble and admirable, are nonetheless overwhelmingly tragic events. With it Jesus is declared to be the Son of God with power (Rom 1.4), and the disciples are transformed from lethargic and defeated followers into the flaming witnesses of the Book of Acts. The Good news about Jesus Christ is that God, by the resurrection of Jesus, defeated sin, death, and hell. It was this message that lay at the heart of the apostolic preaching. (Walter Wessel)

Theological Points derived out of this text:

- 1. The trustworthiness of the record (bibliology) 3 witnesses
- 2. The witness/ministry of angels (angelology) to minister/encourage/remind them of Truth
- 3. The humanity of Jesus Christ (Christology/Humiliation) Jesus the Nazareth
- 4. The deity of Jesus (Christology / Deity) He has risen
- 5. The fear/trembling of man before the supernatural (Anthropology) they feared the presence of God!
- 6. The work of Christ (Soteriology) he was crucified, buried & was raised up!
- 7. The duty of believers "Go and Tell!" (Ecclesiology)
- 8. The defanging of death (powerless) (Jesus rose up from the dead) (Eschatology)

Each member of the Trinity actively worked to raise Jesus

- 1. God raised him up (Acts 2.24 // Acts 10.40// Acts 13.30; // Rom 10.9)
- 2. Jesus raised himself (John 10.17-18)
- 3. The Spirit (Rom 8.11; Rom 1.4)

The bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is the crowning proof of Christianity. If the resurrection did not take place, then Christianity is a false religion. If it did take place, then Christ is God and the Christian faith is absolute truth. (Henry Morris)

10 reasons why the resurrection is *so* essential:

- 1. The resurrection of Jesus Christ means that believers are justified before God. (Rom 4.25)
- 2. The resurrection of Jesus Christ shows that Jesus defeated **death**. (Rom 6.23; 1 COr.15.55-57)
- 3. The resurrection of Jesus Christ means that believers are **united** with Christ. (Rom 6.8)
- 4. The resurrection of Jesus Christ confirms the truth of **Scripture**. (Ps 16.10-11)
- 5. The resurrection of Jesus Christ proves the **gospel** to be true. (1 Cor 15.14, 17-19)
- 6. The resurrection of Jesus Christ proves that Jesus is the Son of God. (Rom 1.4)
- 7. The resurrection of Jesus Christ means that God the Father will give His Holy **Spirit** to believers. (Acts 2.33)
- 8. The resurrection of Jesus Christ gives Christians a living hope. (1 Peter 1.3-4)
- 9. The resurrection of Jesus Christ means that we will be raised like Him. (1 COR 15.20-22)
- 10. The resurrection of Jesus Christ means that Christ will judge the world in righteousness. (Acts 17.30-31)
